





've been writing about beauty for more than 15 years but occasionally can't help feeling I would benefit from a chemistry degree when it comes to understanding the jargon bandied about by skincare companies. And if even I find all the -oxys, -oxides and peptides bamboozling, despite a 20 minute one-to-one with a dermatologist, I've no idea how the average Jo(anna) keeps up.

Take the tidal wave of acids recently launched and often marketed as "peels". These have been declared by everyone who

knows anything about skin to be the must-have addition to your cleansing routine for 2018. But putting something on your face that sounds as though it could remove the enamel from your bath can be quite a leap of faith.

The reality however, is that acids are milder than you might imagine. Essentially liquid exfoliants many of which are simply swept over the skin with a cotton pad, they are a far gentler way to whisk away dead cells and deal with clogged pores than the old-school, grainy face scrubs

of your teenage years, which can cause microscopic tears in the skin's barrier.

A gentle peel is actually one of the best things you can do for your skin, returning radiance and glow within a fortnight. If you're not sure where to start, check out my selection here. Glossier, This Works and REN are great starting points if you're new to acids, while Paula's Choice and Dr Dennis Gross are brilliant when you're ready to bring out the big guns. Now, let's take a closer look at the small print.

AHAs (alpha-hydroxy acids) stimulate skin renewal by breaking the water bonds attaching dead skin cells to healthy skin to whisk away the top layer of cells, which makes them great for dealing with fine lines, dull skin and mild, newly arrived sun damage. Made from plant, milk or fruit sugars, they boost collagen production for firmer skin, too.

Anything marked glycolic, citric or lactic acid falls into this category. Just make sure you are using a daily sunscreen throughout the year if you add these into the mix

as they make you more sensitive to UVA and UVB damage, which is very ageing.

BHAs (beta-hydroxy acids) are also exfoliating, but they work at a deeper level, penetrating skin to help exfoliate inside enlarged or clogged pores. They are antibacterial, so help even out oily skin prone to lumps, bumps and breakouts. Rather than causing irritation, BHAs are anti-inflammatory and help reduce redness. Look for salicylic or benzoic acid on labels to say bye-bye to blemishes.

PHAs (polyhydroxy acids) are functionally similar to AHAs but have larger molecules, making them extra gentle on the skin. They're more hydrating, too. Keep an eye out for gluconolactone and lactobionic acid.

Finally, **Hyaluronic acid**. It's the "acid" I get asked about most. But it isn't an acid in the exfoliation sense of the word. It's a water binding molecule that we make less of as we age and when applied topically helps plump and hydrate the skin.

I actually did a double-take when

passing a mirror the first time I used Swisscode Pure Hyaluron. It looked as though I had borrowed someone else's (much younger) forehead for the evening.

Just when she thought her modelling days were well and truly behind her, actress Isabella Rossellini is back as the face of Lancôme. Amy Packer meets her

here's a certain etiquette at celebrity interviews. At the start you ask a polite number of questions about what the star is promoting and in return you are allowed to be reasonably nosey about other aspects of their life. So to kick off my interview with Italian actress and model Isabella Rossellini, the face of Lancôme Rénergie Multi-Glow, I tell her I'll begin with a few questions about beauty. She sighs audibly.

"I don't like questions like that, they reflect a tradition we are trying to break with me coming back to Lancôme," she says, before launching into the tale of her controversial firing as the face of the French cosmetics giant 22 years ago.

In 1996, having featured in Lancôme's campaigns for 14 years, Isabella was deemed "too old" and dropped. "I was 42 and it was explained that advertisements should be about women's dreams of being young, not reality," she says. So the call to return came as a shock. She thanks Françoise Lehmann, Lancôme's new CEO, for her return.

"I said why me? Dragging me back will also bring back some of the controversy, but I think it had a lot to do with women entering the executive forces. Men only understood make-up when it was addressed to them, so there was a hyper-emphasis on it as a tool of seduction, while most women use it also as pleasure, as a tov. a game for ourselves to help us feel elegant."

The Blue Velvet star insisted the product she was to promote wasn't referred to as an anti-ageing cream. "I was adamant about this because I don't want something to try and hide who I am, to say, 'You're 65, let me make you look 60' - as if that is my goal. I want to be a 65-year-old elegant, sophisticated lady."

We meet at London's Savoy, in a suite brimming with flowers which clearly delight Isabella, who remains seated as we are introduced, regally extending her hand to greet me. Shorter than I anticipated, she is dressed in long, bright, bohemian layers. Her hair is cropped and choppy and it is plain she has never had a knife or needle anywhere near her face.

"I haven't done anything, mostly because I am afraid," she explains. "I had two very severe operations on my back [for spinal deformity scoliosis, one at 13 and one five years ago] and I'm terrified about surgery. And look, I'm right, they called me back," she laughs.

Born in Rome and living near New York, Isabella holds dual citizenship. Her Italian accent remains as strong, with only a slight

hint of north American. While her English is excellent,

> things are still occasionally lost in translation. So when I suggest she fell into modelling, she looks horrified.

"I fell into it?" she exclaims formidably. "I mean, I grew up

A quick explanation - that while acting and working as a television reporter she attended her first model casting as a favour to a friend

- and we are back on track.

"It was so unexpected when I got the cover of Vogue. I thought that would be the only one and bought loads of copies saying I would show them to my grandchildren," she says. "I was 28 and people were taken aback, already saying I was old. But within eight months my career as a model exploded. However, I didn't expect to go on to have 23 covers of Vogue."

Isabella has two children, daughter Elettra, 34, from her marriage to fashion model-turned-Microsoft executive Jonathan Wiedemann, and adopted son Roberto, 24. (She was also married to Martin Scorsese and has been in relationships with 2018 Oscar winner Gary Oldman and director David Lynch.) Both her children have dabbled with careers in modelling.

"I'm surprised they both like fashion so much, that neither one of them wants to be an actor, and that they prefer modelling," she says. "I liked modelling more than acting. It is very similar but you don't have to speak and because I have an accent there was the constant pressure of people saying speak another way, integrate. You can find roles but you are limited in that you can never play the sister or you can never be fully immersed in the group. So I became more visual. Even now, in my work as a director, I make funny films about animals, which are very visual,"

Accent wasn't a problem for her latest role as Vita Sackville-West's mother in the movie Vita And Virginia, due out this year. "Vita's mother was Spanish and I said, 'You want me? I have an accent,' but they explained that Victoria grew up in New York so they wanted a Mediterranean-New York accent."

There was another, pragmatic reason that Isabella preferred modelling, "On a practical level it was easier to be a mother as a model than an actor because films are long. You're away for three or four months so it's difficult for the family. With modelling you work for three or four

days and then you can come home, pause, then get another job. That was the torment I had as a single mother. It was a torture to be away."

Her face visibly lights up at the mention of her three-month-old grandson, Ronin. "I think the most touching thing is the closeness that you feel to your daughter," she says of Elettra, who has moved to Long Island to live with her mother during the early, sleepless days of motherhood. "Of course I love the baby, they elicit in us lots of tenderness, but your first baby is quite shocking and you have so many emotions, are totally overwhelmed with tiredness – and it's touching to be able to help her. It creates a strong bond."

She misses this bond with her own parents, actress Ingrid Bergman and film director Roberto Rossellini. "When my parents died I sensed a void, a precipice behind me, a feeling of darkness and oppressiveness," she recollects.

Despite Ingrid Bergman's reputation as one of the world's most beautiful women, as a child Isabella was largely unaware of her mother's iconic status. "I didn't grow up saying, 'My mum is a superstar and my father is a great intellectual.' To me they were Mum and Dad and I only discovered as I grew older that they held that position in society. I think that is true for my children, as well," she says.

When I comment on a stunning photograph of her with her own children she recently retweeted, she quickly replies, "Me? No. I'm not on Twitter," her tone hardening briefly. When I point out there is an account with her name and picture, complete with blue tick to show the account has been verified as authentic, she says wearily, "This is one of the problems with social media. I see that people are using my name and my face, so if I follow Penélope [Cruz], how do I know if it is really her?

"I don't really understand this world. I am on Instagram, but that is it, and I use it mainly to follow my children so I know where they are as they never tell me. Once I got Instagram I could see where they had been for dinner and what parties they had gone to."

Despite her mistrust of social media, it was Instagram Isabella turned to when her long-time friend and photographer Bruce Weber, who shot so many of her *Vogue* covers, was embroiled in allegations of sexual impropriety. She says it should be a case of innocent until proven guilty, adding, "I don't think it's a problem of the industry. I think it's a general problem. It's just that this industry gets more attention because that is where the celebrities are. I have an organic farm and I was very touched because I received a message from a group of farmers, saying, 'We are standing by you. We have gone through the same.'"

Isabella does have hope that the industry and its representation of women is improving, though not because people are striving to make things better, but rather due to consumer demand.

"I think maybe platforms like Netflix and Amazon are reaching niches of people who were not reachable before," she says. "Mothers couldn't go out at night, so didn't go to the cinema, or their show was on at 8pm on Wednesday but the baby was crying and they missed the episode, so the industry didn't really try to speak to them. Now you can find and download whatever you want, when you are free to watch it, so they can reach new audiences – women and families. These new ways of distribution mean they have to make stories that are of interest to those groups. I think that will bring more interesting roles for women."

For someone in the public eye from her teens, the moment Isabella actually realised just how famous she'd become is surprising – when she was invited to star in an episode of *Friends*. "They asked me to appear and I went on as myself – as Isabella Rossellini. That was 'wow'. I once read that Charlie Chaplin understood he was famous in the US because he was walking through Times Square and saw the news on a big screen, saying, 'Charlie Chaplin arrives in New York.' That was how my *Friends* moment felt to me. I wasn't playing a character, I played myself. I knew I was a successful model but I thought that was within the industry of fashion and cosmetics, not the whole of America."

From The Wire and Game Of Thrones to his latest comedy incarnation as Dave Allen, Aidan Gillen never shies away from a challenge Words by Amy Packer

idan Gillen has his mother's hot toddies to thank for getting his acting career off the ground. Having appeared in a few Irish theatre productions, at 18 the Dubliner moved to London to try and crack the West End but returned to Ireland nine months later with his tail between his legs.

"I'm sure my parents were delighted when I headed off on my big adventure," says the 49 year old. "So when I came back my mother was disappointed and sent me to an audition at London's National Theatre a few months later. I wasn't sure about going, as I was dying with the flu, but she bottled me up a couple of homemade whiskey concoctions and packed me off. I got the job."

An extremely close family, his parents were a great support during his early days on the London stage. "My folks never missed a theatre show I was in apart from once when my father was too ill," he reveals. "They'd come over and stay in a hotel at King's Cross or the Regent Palace at Piccadilly Circus and always bring me out for a steak – even if I didn't want one."

Aidan's career has skyrocketed since those days, having won roles

in some of TV's biggest shows, including Game Of Thrones, Pe including Game Of Thrones, Peaky Blinders and The wire, as won and playing a CIA agent in his first major Hollywood film, 2012's The Dark Knight Rises.

Today he is talking about his latest drama, the new BBC2 biopic Dave Allen At Peace. It was a part he came to with an almost entirely blank slate.

"To be honest, I didn't know Dave Allen that well as a kid," he says of the comedy legend famed for his acerbic bar-stool routines. "Well, apart from seeing him on a chat show one night and having a grim fascination with that finger, or rather missing finger, and there being an air of danger around him."

The late Dave Allen never shied away from controversy, taking down organised religion and the Roman Catholic church in barbed diatribes that led to a ban from Irish TV. But Aidan, himself brought up in a religious household, had no qualms about recreating the routines.

Of his upbringing, he says, "Our house was well decked out with holy pictures and crucifixes, but it all seemed normal. I didn't like catching Jesus's reflection in the mirror, though. I thought that was probably the devil, so the magic must have worked on me."

These days, Aidan only finds himself in church for filming. "I prayed and went to mass and all but there came a time in my mid-teens when I left all that behind. I still like the smell [of churches] though. I find them peaceful."

From Romany hitman Aberama Gold in the most recent series of Peaky Blinders to Petyr "Littlefinger" Baelish in Game Of Thrones, fans aren't used to seeing Aidan in comedy roles, but he pulls off Allen's sets skilfully and is a dead ringer for the comedian.


"I've not done much comedy in my later life but I have been making an effort to lighten up a bit," he confesses. "My first few roles were comedic and it was getting laughs in early shows that encouraged me to go down this road."

As for Game Of Thrones, he says it felt great not to make it to the show's final season, quipping, "Get out early and get some good gigs while the rest of them are tied up contractually."

The series, which was filmed in Northern Ireland, gave him the opportunity to get to know a part of the country he hadn't spent much time in previously. "My time there prior to Game Of Thrones was limited to late 1990," he recalls. "Things felt very different then. I liked it, particularly Derry, but it was kind of high octane, as I was from Dublin. I didn't really know my way around – I was jumpy.

"I've really enjoyed getting to spend so much time there over the last six or seven years. I've met some great people."

The cult hit brought the actor a level of fame that could potentially be uncomfortable

 interviewers often remark on Aidan's shy demeanour, quiet, halting sentences and hatred of small talk. But the actor doesn't consider himself overly reserved.

"I am kind of shy but not so much that I wouldn't strip off occasionally in front of a crowd of strangers and TV cameras I suppose," he says. "The actor shyness thing is a strange mix. A lot of shy, retiring actors are actually blazing exhibitionists on the side."

The father of a 19-year-old daughter, Berry, and a son, Joe, 17, Aidan has certainly played his share of "blazing exhibitionists", from his breakout character Stuart in Channel 4's *Queer As Folk* in 1999 to slimy politician Tommy Carcetti in HBO's *The Wire*. "It's good to play those parts, because that's what you're doing, playing at being things that you're not," he says. "You can get away with everything."

Does that create an expectation among fans? "Being recognised is something that comes with the gig, I suppose, particularly if you're in widely seen shows," he says. "Hats and moustaches are good. I have those in my current role (new History UFO drama *Blue Book*).

"I don't know what people expect in real life, to be honest. I suppose they'll get you in whatever mood you're in. I try to be friendly."




"Lauren is incredibly neurotic – the sort of person who'd look at Instagram and think, 'I need to look like this if I'm going to meet somebody'," she says. "It's why I wanted to be part of the show. It has a great message."

Natalie, who just missed out on making the live finals of *Pop Idol* back in 2001 before carving out a career in TV and theatre, is currently touring in *Fat Friends The Musical* with an all-star cast that includes Andrew "Freddie" Flintoff and Jodie Prenger. "Everyone has been brilliant," she says. "It's a brand-new show, new material, new songs, so we were all thrown in at the deep end in October with a four-week run in Leeds.

"I had my concerns before I signed up because it is a long time and so I worried about what it would be like if the dynamics weren't great, but we slotted together easily. I think it's because we all started on the journey together. There's great support and camaraderie. I laughed so much in the first few weeks that my ribs hurt." Although soap fans might imagine this is how





close-knit the team was during Natalie's five years as Alicia Metcalfe in *Emmerdale*, she says the reality isn't quite the same. "The difference with working on a soap is that there are 60 of you in the cast but you don't see half of them for six months at a time. I suppose it's more similar to *The Royal* [she played Nurse Stella Davenport from 2005 to 2008]. There were only 13 regular characters and we were together all the time during filming."

Apart from the chance to flex her vocal
muscles again – Natalie trained in musical
theatre as a teenager and starred as Nessarose
in the London production of *Wicked* in 2009
– there was another reason the *Fat Friends* tour
appealed to her. "A lot of the dates are

Spending plenty of quality time with her family is something Natalie learned the importance of after returning to work on *Emmerdale* when Freddie, the be who is now five, was only 12 weeks old.

"I think I completely underestimated how I would feel about being a mum," she admits. "When I agreed to go back that quickly I hadn't really any idea of how life was going to be with a baby. I found it difficult and never saw him and that's not why I became a mum. I wanted to be really hands-on. In the end I decided I couldn't keep up that pace.

"There's so much pressure on us as women today to be brilliant at everything – to look fabulous and have a career and be the best mum and the best wife – but something has to give. Having done it once I know that if we were to have another child I would definitely look to take at least six months off."

Luckily, being near her family doesn't require any compromise in the quality of her roles. "There are huge opportunities for people like me in the north – just look at shows like *Happy Valley* and *Last Tango In Halifax*," Natalie says. "The Yorkshire and Lancashire landscape is stunning for filming and we have incredible theatre, too, brilliant productions at Manchester Royal Exchange and in Leeds Grand Theatre.

"It makes me feel a bit more secure about the work that's out there for people like me who want to be a mum but keep doing what they love as well."

Something that has allowed Natalie to keep

working while raising her son is that her husband James takes an equal share of running their household. "He's amazing," she says. "We share everything. It's every man for himself in our house. James was a financial advisor for 20 years but took time out to be a stay-at-home dad to Fred and now he's building up a new career as a personal trainer, so anyone who is available does the ironing or the cooking or changes the beds."

The pair got together 13 years ago when Natalie, who was a cheerleader for Bradford Bulls rugby team, met James, a fan of rival team Leeds Rhinos, in a bar after a big game and tried to set him up with a friend. But he only had eyes for her and they are celebrating 10 years of

marriage this summer with "a holiday to Dubai with our parents and friends and then a couple of days away just the two of us."

Family is very important to the actress, who has quite a collection of siblings. "We're like the Kardashians, we're terrible," she laughs. "I have two sisters who are a similar age to me then, on my dad's side, I also have a brother who is 18, a little sister who is 11 and another who is three. We get on so well and have

the best times. We're a mismatched, mad family but we love being together. It's only a few times a year that we get to be in the same room at the same time but it's great fun."

If any of them was to follow in her footsteps, she predicts it would be her 11-year-old sister, Francesca. "She's really into performing arts – she played Billy Elliott in her school production recently – and is showing signs that she wants to go into the industry. But me, being the strict big sister, I keep saying, 'She's too young, she's too young', even though I started at 13. It's very different now and I know how it is with younger actors in the industry, how you think everything is so important when you are that age. I think she needs to wait a while."

Natalie certainly won't be lining Francesca up for a spot on *The X Factor* any time soon. "I was 19 when I did *Pop Idol* and the way those shows have changed now, there's no way I could do it in the modern world," she admits. "The pressure and the hoops they have to jump through — I would have been a nervous wreck and been out straight away if I'd had to do the Six Chair Challenge. The fame is so instant and so global.

"I'm happy things developed at a much slower pace for me. I was able to build my career on my own terms."

Great escapes Edited by Laura Mulley

For hospitality, food and rugged scenery, you can't beat charming County Kerry

ou know a place has truly got you when you feel a deep sadness as you leave. County Kerry did just that. It's a combination of the scenery, the people, their outlook on life and the food – and more on that later.

I had travelled to this beautiful corner of southwest Ireland with my mum and sister for a few days of R&R and catching up. And we couldn't have chosen a better spot.

We flew with Aer Lingus to Cork, then picked up a hire car to take us out to the Ring of Kerry and along the aptly named Wild Atlantic Way. This covers 2,500km of coastline along the west of Ireland from Derry to Kerry. We managed to cover just a fraction of it, but every part we saw was just breathtaking.

Our base for the four days was the Parknasilla Resort & Spa, overlooking Kenmare Bay. The hotel is one of the finest in the area and houses beautiful antiques, chandeliers and paintings by old masters. But while it might be grand in its furnishings, it is not at all stuffy in its manner.

Over the years the hotel has played host to the great and the good, from George Bernard Shaw and Westlife's Nicky Byrne to writer Cecelia Ahern and her father, the former Irish Taoiseach Bertie Ahern. Offbeat film *The Lobster* was filmed here, too, with Colin Farrell and Rachel Weisz staying as guests – and a certain 007 coming to visit.

It is an absolutely perfect base from which to explore. Every day we took off and discovered unspoilt beaches and breathtaking views. One of our favourite places was Derrynane beach, a long, glorious strand of white sand. When we visited on a blustery but beautiful day we were the only people there.

We also visited the very pretty village of Sneem which, with its multicoloured buildings and hanging baskets, is the perfect place to stop for a big mug of tea and a slice of carrot cake – and we stopped a lot for food.

The breakfasts at Parknasilla had everything you could want – eggs, black and white pudding, potatoes and so much bread. We couldn't get enough of the delicious soda bread, even having it as a starter at dinner.

We also visited the pretty town of Portmagee. It is just minutes from Skellig Michael, a UNESCO World Heritage site. A monastery was founded on the island between the sixth and eighth centuries and it is an incredible feat of engineering. Just scaling it is tough, so how they managed to build the beehive cells here is beyond belief.

Skellig Michael has also found greater fame recently, thanks to *Star Wars*. The final scenes of *Star Wars: The Force Awakens* were filmed here and it is where sequel *The Last Jedi* picks up where the story left off.

You can go on Star Wars boat trips around the island and you can see why director J J Abrams chose this spot. It is completely remote and otherworldly.

This part of Ireland is home to the Kerry International Dark-Sky Reserve. It is one of only three gold-tier reserves on the planet – the others are in Namibia and New Zealand – and the only one in the northern hemisphere. On clear nights at Staigue Fort, a stronghold said to date from the Iron Age, you can see the most incredible display of stars.

After all this walking and stargazing we had built up an appetite, so decamped to the Staigue Fort hotel. The lovely landlady Sheila let us dry out our soggy boots by the fire, while we had a pint of the black stuff and Tayto crisps. Heaven. §

How to bank holds

Tetchy, fractious or crabby? Lighten up with our feel-good guide and temper your temper, says Michele O'Connor

he average Briton spends
41 minutes a day in a
bad mood – equating
to one year and eight
months of their life. And
almost half of the 2,000 adults
polled in a new study admit to
having days where they feel grumpy
from the moment they wake up
until they go to bed at night.

"It's the everyday things that add up – everything from a poor night's sleep to technology and rudeness, amounting to a large chunk of our time," reveals Dr Jen Tan of A Vogel Herbal Remedies, which was behind the study.

Here, a number of experts suggest how people can banish those dark days and darker moods.

Food for thought

"Foods play a huge part in affecting your mood," says Tara Jackson, holistic self-care and wellness coach. "If you eat foods with artificial ingredients, sweeteners and additives it is likely you'll be suffering from mood swings as your body isn't getting the nutrition it needs to function properly. The addition of chemicals in many processed foods can also play havoc with your moods and emotions. Try to replace them with fruits, vegetables, wholegrains, lean protein and healthy fats."

Scientists have found that a Mediterranean-style diet boosts the mood and reduces the risk of depression by about 30 per cent.

"Our gut is often referred to as our second brain, as there appears to be a clear association between changes in the gut microbiota and the production of neurotransmitters influencing our mood," says nutritional therapist Natalie Lamb. "Multi-strain probiotic supplements can improve gut flora balance, increase vitamin D levels and improve mood."

Clinical nutritionist Suzie Sawyer adds, "Porridge provides a great

'hit' of serotonin, our happy hormone, to keep you smiling all day long."

Feeling low, cranky or angry can be a symptom of low blood sugar, warns nutritionist Fiona Hunter. "Try a snack with a mix of fast and slow release carbs, like mashed banana on wholemeal toast or a few oatcakes with peanut butter, to restore blood sugar and boost levels of serotonin in the brain," she advises.

Suzie also recommends eating five eggs a week. "Eggs are the


perfect brain food," she insists.
"They contain lecithin which is
needed for great brain function and
to keep you feeling happy."



Healthspan personal trainer Nicola Addison says, "Exercise boosts levels of brain chemicals serotonin, dopamine and norepinephrine, which help buffer the effects of low mood, stress and anxiety.

"In a study published in the American Journal Of Preventive Medicine involving 80 adults aged





20 to 45 years with mild to moderate depression, researchers explored the effects of exercise. They found that symptoms were almost halved in those who participated in 30-minute aerobic exercise sessions, three to five times a week after 12 weeks."

Yoga requires great focus, according to Cheryl MacDonald, founder of yogabellies.co.uk.

"Some poses not only ask you to hold your body in a balanced position, they also ask you to pay attention and make slight adjustments to improve the pose. Focusing solely on your body is akin to meditation," she says, while psychologist Dr Meg Arroll adds, "Walking in the park aids blood flow to the brain, while connecting with nature is beneficial to our emotional wellbeing."

Sweet dreams

Go to bed early: When people are sleep deprived they feel more irritable and angry, and waking several times in the night is more detrimental to positive mood than a shorter period of unbroken sleep.

Include tryptophan-rich foods, such as turkey, beans, peas and lentils in your evening meal: The body uses this amino acid to make serotonin, which is known to help moderate mood, emotion and sleep.

Change your bed linen: "There's nothing quite like the feeling of getting out of a bath into a clean bed to make a difference to your mood," says Angela Moran, product strategy director at bed manufacturer Silentnight.

Ideas that really work

- Meet a friend: "Face-to-face human contact prompts physiological responses in the brain that benefit our mental health in a way that technology-based contact can't," says nutritionist Antonia Magor.
- Socialise wisely: New research by the University of Warwick suggests that both good and bad moods can be "picked up" from friends.
- "Even if smiling is the last thing you feel like doing, a fake smile will not only help lift your mood but lower blood pressure, reduce stress and release feel-good endorphins," Dr Arroll says.
- Get up and do something: Life coach Claire Nicole Stansfield advises, "Don't ponder on whatever has triggered your bad mood. Instead, shift your mindset and do something to distract you the washing, sort out a cupboard, read a book anything. A diversion allows your emotions to calm down and you'll be in a better frame of mind after the task."
- Breathe: Athletes and singers know the importance of breathing

properly. "Take 10 deep breaths," says Claire. "This helps restore the balance between the parasympathetic (restorative) and sympathetic (fight-or-flight) nervous systems, buffering your natural reaction to stressful situations."

- Make a list: "It should include things that will make you feel better, like buying yourself flowers, taking some time out or even booking a hair appointment," advises Claire. "Lists force you to structure your concerns and help you move into problem-solving mode."
- Press pause: Amanda Dicker, creator of a new calming collection of candles, hand creams and pulse point scents, says, "Take your time applying hand cream then cup your hands to your face and breathe in the uplifting aroma, which will bring attention back to your breathing. Likewise, deflect tension from the mind by rolling calming scent on to key pulse points, like the neck, inner elbow and wrist."
- Pop it out: If you're verging on anger take a novel approach and try popping the air pockets in bubble wrap, Dr Arroll suggests. "This releases the bad mood in a tactile way and the noise of the popping plastic helps to express the negative emotion, providing relief."
- Hug: "The average hug lasts 2.1 seconds but needs to last seven seconds or longer to make a difference," says Andy Cope, author of Happiness: Your Route-Map To Inner Joy (£12.99, see the Bookshop on page 82).
- And hygge for longer: This helps
 Denmark to consistently rank in the world's top three happiest countries, says Andy. "Sitting by the fire on a cold night, wearing a woolly jumper, while drinking hot chocolate and stroking the cat that's pretty much hygge," he says.
 High five: "The supplement 5-HTF
- High five: "The supplement 5-HTP is created from tryptophan which helps raise serotonin levels and is backed by robust research with more than 30 peer-reviewed clinical studies assessing its efficacy in more than 1,000 patients," says pharmacist, Mike Wakeman.
- Try a vitamin D mouth spray, suggests nutritionist Rick Hay. "If you're low on vitamin D this can exacerbate low mood," he warns.

It's how you handle things

The American jazz musician Miles Davis once said, "When you hit a wrong note, it's the next note that makes it good or bad." This can apply to life, too, says Dr Mark Winwood. director of psychological services at AXA PPP healthcare. "It's perfectly normal to be in a bad mood sometimes," he says. "What matters is how you deal with it and what you do next." **Stay optimistic:** "Evidence shows you're able to change your mood much more easily than you may think," Dr Winwood says. "People who realise this also feel more positive about life. Those who assume they can't control their feelings tend to be unhappier. So remember that you can make a difference to how you feel."

Set yourself a daily routine:

"Reducing stress in your life and taking active steps to manage your time better can improve your mood, making you feel more in control of your day," he adds. "Work out your top priorities, break them down into more manageable tasks and complete one task at a time. Figure out what time of day you're at your best and do the most demanding task then."

Allow yourself to break out **of your routine:** Try a new recipe for dinner, sign up for a different gym class or visit somewhere you haven't been before, suggests Dr Winwood. "Trying something new can make you feel courageous and more confident and you may discover something you really like, find new friends or develop a new skill you never thought you could master." Talk to someone who will **listen:** Talking about the things that make you feel stressed. angry or anxious can help relieve negative feelings and improve your mood.

Doctor, doctor

My 32-year-old husband is a bodybuilder and has gout from eating so much red meat. Will he have this for life?

The best way of managing gout in someone who is otherwise healthy

is to reduce the amount of purinecontaining foods they eat (purine triggers uric acid in the blood, causing gout). Even though he is a bodybuilder, he may be eating more protein than he requires. Cutting back on his red meat won't make any difference to his muscles and could stop his gout attacks. If his attacks continue, treatment with drugs that boost the excretion of uric acid usually stops gout attacks. Unfortunately, if he is an under-excreter of uric acid (which he may have inherited from one of his parents), this will be a lifelong

condition. He should also avoid becoming dehydrated (which concentrates uric acid in the blood) and also avoid too much alcohol.







Green goddess dip and vegetable grissini

200g (7oz) cherry tomatoes A handful of parsley leaves

500g (1lb 1¾oz) halloumi cheese 200g (7oz) baby leaf salad 50g (1¾oz) pomegranate seeds

- Peel, halve and thinly slice the onions and chilli into half-moons. Sauté in a large saucepan over a medium heat with half the oil for 2 minutes until slightly softening.
- Add the vinegar, stir until fully absorbed into the onions and add the sugar. Cook for a further 4-5 minutes, stirring frequently, then spoon into a bowl and allow to cool for 10 minutes.
- Halve the tomatoes, and roughly chop the parsley and coriander. Mix with the cooled onions and season to taste. Don't over-salt as the halloumi is already quite salty.
- Cut down through the fold in the middle of the halloumi so you have 4 flat rectangles. Dice each half into 8 pieces then dab dry with kitchen paper this will help it to fry.
- Toss together the baby leaves,

pomegranate seeds and onions then spread over a large platter or salad bowl.

- Heat a non-stick frying pan with the rest of the oil over a medium heat. Fry the halloumi cubes for 1-2 minutes then turn and repeat. You will only need to fry on 2 sides to leave the halloumi soft.
- Scatter the halloumi over the salad and serve with toasted flatbreads.


Bean smash with trout and goat's cheese

Serves: 4

Preparation time: 20 minutes Cooking time: 5 minutes

1 red onion
1 head of fennel
2est and juice of 1 lemon
4 trout fillets
Salt and pepper
3 tbsps olive oil
100g (3½oz) fresh peas
100g (3½oz) shelled broad beans
100g (3½oz) edamame beans

- Heat a large non-stick frying pan with 1 tablespoon of olive oil over a medium heat. Fry the trout, skin side down, for 2-3 minutes or until the skin is golden brown and crispy. Flip the fillets, sprinkle the skin with salt and fry for a further 30 seconds or until the trout is fully cooked through. This will depend on the thickness of the fillets.
- Meanwhile, boil the peas, broad beans and edamame for 2 minutes.
- Drain fully then place back into the saucepan and lightly crush using a potato masher.

150g (5½/4oz) dried coconut chips or desiccated coconut

- Mix the flour, 150g (5½oz) of golden caster sugar and 190g (6¾oz) of butter in a food processor until it resembles fresh breadcrumbs.
- Preheat the oven to 160°C/325°F/gas mark 2½. Lightly grease and line a 20x30cm (8x12in) baking dish with baking paper.
- Press 500g (1lb 1³/₄oz) of crumble mix into the baking dish so that it's flat and compressed then chill for 20 minutes.
- Bake for 20 minutes or until lightly golden.
- Meanwhile, peel, core and dice the apples. Mix in a large saucepan with the 120g (4½oz) golden caster sugar and 50g (1¾oz) of butter.
- Cover and cook the apples over a medium heat for 4 minutes. Uncover and cook for 7-8 minutes or until the liquid has been absorbed and the apples are just cooked through.
- Grate in the orange zest then spoon evenly over the baked crumble base.
- Mix the remaining crumble with the coconut. Sprinkle over the apples and bake for a further 20 minutes or until lightly golden on top.
- Allow to cool a little then serve warm with ice cream and decorated with apple slices. Or serve cool and sliced as snacks.

I was particularly taken by pinot noir, which is one of my favourite varieties and is well adapted to the cooler climates of New Zealand's wine regions. Here's my magnificent seven of delicious yet relatively affordable pinor noirs.

The Stranger *****

by Kate Riordan (Michael Joseph, £12.99)

In 1940, three young women arrive in Cornwall as members of the Women's Land Army. Diana, Rose and Jane are set to work as gardeners and their temporary home is Penhallow Hall, the home of 35-year-old Eleanor and her cantankerous, domineering mother, Mrs Fox.

Each of the women brings with them a secret and a distinct personality. Beautiful, flirtatious Diana has been expelled from school, although we don't know why until near the end of the novel, and "banished" to the countryside by her mother.

Rose is 30, married to a brutish man she doesn't love, and haunted by memories of a teenage love affair on a Cornish holiday years before. The reader might guess the secret about Jane's past long before Jane herself discovers it.

This richly textured novel explores depression, suicide, sexual abuse and the objectification of

women. Dysfunctional family relationships are subtly drawn and the author has a particularly acute understanding of the multifarious tensions between mothers and daughters.

She evokes the Cornish landscape in both its beauty and isolation. The influence of Daphne du Maurier's *Rebecca* infuses the novel, from imposing Penhallow Hall to the Silver Moon Ball, where the story reaches its dramatic climax.

The Stranger is a novel about loss: lost childhoods, lost loves, lost family relationships and lost freedoms. But Kate Riordan's intricately plotted story offers hope and redemption in its clever and deeply satisfying conclusion.

Last Letter From Istanbul ****

by Lucy Foley (HarperCollins, £14.99)

The year is 1921 and Istanbul has been occupied by the British for three years. Nur has been evicted from her opulent home, which the British requisitioned to use as a military

hospital. She now lives a meagre life. Her father is dead, her brother is missing in action and her husband has been killed in battle: "Each grief is not something to be experienced and overcome... it becomes a part of the self."

Nur lives with her psychologically damaged mother, her exacting grandmother, and a seven-year-old orphaned Armenian boy she rescued from his burning home.

When the boy becomes gravely ill one night, Nur is forced to seek help from the British army hospital. There she meets medical officer George Monroe and despite Nur's antipathy towards the British, a wary attraction develops between them. As their friendship progresses, political tensions rise, bringing the story – and their relationship – to a poignant conclusion.



How I Lose You ****

by Kate McNaughton (Doubleday, £16.99)

It takes a brave author to kill off one half of her central couple on page 12, but Kate McNaughton's intriguing debut is no conventional love story.

Adam and Eva are a seemingly happily married

couple in their early thirties but then a previously undiagnosed heart condition kills Adam in his sleep. As Eva's world falls apart, the narrative alternates between her grief in the present and the back story of their relationship: their first meeting at university; the holiday with friends when Eva first realises Adam has feelings for her; enjoying a trip to New York when the Twin Towers were hit. But as we delve deeper into the past, we discover their marriage was not without its tensions.

Meanwhile, in the present-day narrative, Eva discovers the name of a woman Adam knew when he worked in Berlin and begins to wonder whether he was faithful. She heads to Berlin in search of the truth but once there, her story takes an unexpected turn, forcing her to confront disturbing revelations about her own family history and her mother's escape from East Berlin decades before.

For all its structural ambition, the novel's timeline can be confusing and some of the dialogues are overlong. But what sets the novel apart is the writer's perceptive and moving writing about grief: "You are like an animal being hit by a stun gun... scrabbling on the mossy ground as you try to get up again, but then they hit you with another shot, and another, and another..."

Thoughtful and sensitive, *How I Lose You* is an engaging debut about love, loss, memory and the stories we tell ourselves to make sense of our past and reimagine our present.

Lucy, who is facing difficulties of her own, accompanies her aunt in the hope of laying to rest her demons. Liz Fenwick, known for her absorbing and often heart-breaking Cornish novels, explores how one must confront the past in order to manage the future.




Last Letter Home



"THIS picture of me (second left) and my sisters was taken around 1980, when I was probably about 21. We're all

excitedly showing off our first tour jackets, which were silk and had The Nolans embroidered on the back. I'd just had my hair permed for the photo shoot at the Grosvenor House hotel in London and as I walked into the dressing room the girls went 'ohh' at my hair. Then said nothing. I cried.

We were there for a publicity shoot before our first big tour and our hit song *I'm In The Mood For Dancing* had just been released.

On the left-hand side of the picture is Maureen. Then there's me with the curly hair, then Anne, the eldest of us, and Bernie on the right. Anne was always the one in charge, Maureen was the peacemaker, and Bernie and I were the gobby ones.

There were eight children in our family, Tommy was the eldest, then Anne, Denise, Maureen, Brian, then me, Bernie and Coleen. We were all born in Dublin apart from Coleen, who was born in Blackpool where we moved to in 1963.

When we were younger, we used to sing with our parents Maureen and Tommy Nolan, who were very successful in their own right in Ireland. Then in 1973, someone from a record company saw us singing and we were invited to work at the New London Theatre

in Drury Lane. We were then given producers, choreographers and stylists and we became The Nolans.

Even though I'm known for being one of The Nolans, I have been singing since I was four so I've been in showbiz for over 50 years. But when this photo was taken, it was the start of our real success.

Our brothers stayed in Blackpool – they both had jobs and girlfriends. Meanwhile, Coleen was still at school in Blackpool, so Dad stayed with her and Mum came to London with us.

Our first tour was hard work but because we were sisters, we always had a friend. With sisters, you can have a row that sounds like World War Three at the time, then within half an hour you are all friends again.

I vividly remember sitting at our house in Blackpool at the age of 10 watching *Top Of The Pops*. Then suddenly we were on it in 1980 – I felt like we had made really it.

I'm In The Mood For Dancing was one of our biggest hits. It got to number three in Britain but it was number one in Japan and Europe. That was the start of everything.

The other highlight was when we toured Europe with Frank Sinatra in 1975 for two weeks. We were brought up on Sinatra,



so we screamed when we found out he had picked us as an opening act. Our dad was actually Ireland's Frank Sinatra and used to sing with all the big bands. He'd tried to get tickets to go and see him at the Royal Albert Hall but couldn't get any. Then when we were asked to do the tour, we brought Dad backstage to meet him and for the first time in his life, he was speechless.

We did do a reunion in 2009 with me, Bernie, Maureen and Coleen, and we were talking about another before Bernie was re-diagnosed in 2012 with her breast cancer (she died in 2013). At the moment, it's still too fresh and raw to do something without her.

When you get a diagnosis like mine with secondary breast cancer,

you look at life in a completely different way. I always took things for granted but now when I am with my nieces and nephews, I spend time with them, make memories and laugh with them. I make sure I let people know that I love them.

I have a CT scan every three months to see if the cancer has stayed in my hip and thankfully the treatment is working. I try not to fret in between scans, though, otherwise I am letting cancer rule me.

I am living with cancer and will, hopefully, be able to work with it as well. I don't have any choice."







> > So much for preaching honesty is the best policy.


