# Amendments provide **Incentives for** Startup India

Government of India launched the 'Startup India' initiative on January 16, 2016 to build a strong eco-system for nurturing innovation and entrepreneurship. This measure of the Government is helping create large scale job opportunities across the sectors and increase economic growth of the country.

As part of this initiative, Department of Industrial Policy and Promotion has issued gazette notification No 364(E) dated 11 April, 2018 constituting a broad based Inter-Ministerial Board (IMB) to consider applications of Startups for claim of following incentives of the Income Tax Act 1961(hereinafter referred as Act):

**Exemption from levy of income** tax on share premium received by eligible Startups under section 56 of the Act.

100% deduction of the profits and gains from income of Startups for three out of seven consecutive assessment years under 80 IAC of the Act.

Applications for certification of startups under section 56 and Section 80 IAC of the Act will be submitted through an online portal to DIPP. These applications will be considered by IMB for certification.

For the purposes of section 56 of the Act, there is no restriction on class of investors and eligible startups can receive investment from any person against issue of share capital.

As a continuous endeavour of the Government to facilitate startup eco-system in the country, DIPP has been holding regular stakeholder consultations including stakeholder consultations including with Government ministries/ departments, regulators, angel investors and startups. Amendments introduced through this notification are meant to address key demand of startups with regard to exemptions under the Income Tax Act, 1961.

With the introduction of amendments through this notification, startups are likely to have easy access to funding which in turn will ensure ease in starting of new businesses, promote startup eco-system, encourage entrepreneurship leading to more job creation and economic growth in the country.

# APM Terminals Mumbai handles record number of containers in 2017

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


### THE MARKET ROUNDUP

The Market Roundup for the global and domestic markets for Thursday (12 Apr'18) is as follows:


- Global stocks (including U.S. and Europe) inched up with the easing of geopolitical concerns with the US softening its stance on a strike on Syria. Gains in banking, technology and industrial sectors on optimism of stronger corporate earnings' season further supported the market rise.
- US dollar strengthened against the euro and yen on improved risk appetite which led to a rise in equities. The disappointing industrial production data weighed on the Euro.
- US treasury yields rose on improved risk appetite amongst investors and the easing of geo-political tension. Expectation of faster interest rate hikes by the Federal Reserve's following the release of the minutes of the latest meeting also aided the climb in yields.
- Asian markets declined weighed down by geo-political concerns.
- Crude oil prices were supported by the fall in OPEC production and geo-political concerns in the Middle East. Reports of rising non-OPEC output limited the price rise.
- Gold prices fell with the weakness in the US dollar.
- Indian equity markets rose buoyed by information technology stocks amid expectations of stronger corporate earnings.
- The rupee strengthened against US dollar aided by gains in the domestic equity markets. Selling of US dollars by bankers and exporters further supported the currency.
- GSec rose on increase foreign investor buying of government securities. Concerns over rising crude oil prices and selling by domestic PSU banks kept yields at elevated levels.

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# Nitin Gadkari Addresses Korea-India Infrastructure Cooperation Forum

On the fourth day of his visit to the Republic of Korea, Union Minister of Road Transport and Highways, Shipping, Water Resources, River Development and Ganga Rejuvenation Shri Nitin Gadkari addressed the delegates of the Korea-India Infrastructure Cooperation Forum in Seoul.
