## RECIPES WITH SENSE OF PLACE

» MENUS are usually things you quickly scan before discarding. For food writer Diana Henry though, menus are so much more than that, and not purely the domain of restaurants either.

"At the weekend, I've always got friends calling me asking, 'Di, what can I do for a starter that's really quick?', or they'll have decided on the main course but will say, 'What can I do for a pudding?'"

"I'm always telling people what goes with what," she explains. The Sunday Telegraph and Waitrose Weekend writer's new cookbook, *How To Eat A Peach*, combines her love of matching ingredients with planning meals. "I love putting menus together for no reason whatsoever," she says, remembering how she'd jot down food plans as a teenager, filling a 'fantasy' notebook with meals she'd cook in an ideal world. She began having people round for supper when she was about 16 (her parents had parties, not

dinner parties), and the menu planning never ceased. How *To Eat A Peach* was inspired, both in title and content, by an evening Diana spent in Italy, watching a group of Italians slicing white fleshed peaches and dropping them into glasses of ice cold Moscato, only to drink the liquid and then pick out and eat the soft fruit, sticky and plump with the booze.

"It's such a lovely way to end a meal, but is also a really good approach to cooking," says Diana.

The book helps you tread the line between "when to not do very much, and when to do very much".

The collection is woven through with a sense of place, with each chapter grounded by a moment in time, a memory of a place, a season, as well as a single, or set of, ingredients.

"One of the main reasons I cook is to go back to places; or go to places," she explains. Diana, now London-based with two sons of her own, travels a lot, but didn't

as one of four children growing up in Northern Ireland. "It seems crazy, but in the mid-Seventies, you couldn't get peppers and aubergines in Northern Ireland – those were exotic" she says, recalling how she wrangled her greengrocer into ordering them especially so she could make ratatouille.

Aged 15, she finally went abroad for the first time – to France on an exchange trip, where a boy taught her to make perfectly lacy crepes before years of Easters spent in Normandy and Brittany followed. The memories are stirred intrinsically into chapter one, 'Cider and gitanes', while the time she went to meet a man about a horse in a bar with her father in Spain defines 'Darkness and light', where squid ink and rice are paired with romesco sauce.

## ASPARAGUS, PEAS AND RADISHES WITH PISTACHIO PESTO

(SERVES 6)

## INGREDIENTS

FOR THE PESTO:

- » 150G SHELLED UNSALTED PISTACHIO NUTS
- » 8 SPRING ONIONS, TRIMMED AND CHOPPED
- » 15G UNSALTED BUTTER
- » 1 FAT GARLIC CLOVE, CRUSHED
- » 170ML EXTRA VIRGIN OLIVE OIL
- » 130G RICOTTA, PREFERABLY FRESH RATHER THAN UHT
- » 40G PECORINO OR PARMESAN CHEESE, FINELY GRATED
- » SEA SALT FLAKES AND FRESHLY GROUND BLACK PEPPER

FOR THE VEGETABLES:

- » 8-10 RADISHES, PREFERABLY FRENCH BREAKFAST RADISHES
- » 650G ASPARAGUS
- » 3TBSP EXTRA VIRGIN OLIVE OIL
- » 3/4TBSP WHITE BALSAMIC VINEGAR
- » 200G FRESH RAW PEAS
- » 25G PEA SHOOTS

## METHOD

1 Start with the pesto. Boil two-thirds of the pistachios in water for four minutes; this softens them and makes the pesto creamy. Drain and dry them in a tea towel. You need to rub off all the papery skin (laborious but therapeutic). Lightly toast the rest of the nuts in a dry pan for about 30 seconds. You will be able to smell the toasted aroma. Immediately transfer to a plate.

2 Cook the spring onions in the butter in a small saucepan until soft, but not coloured. Add the garlic and cook for another 30 seconds or so. Blitz all the nuts with the spring onions and garlic in a food processor, gradually adding the extra virgin olive oil. Stir in the ricotta and



pecorino or Parmesan. Season and taste.

3 Now for the vegetables. Shave the radishes using a mandoline, or cut them very finely with a sharp knife. Break or cut off the base of each asparagus spear (if you use your hands rather than a knife, you can feel where the natural break is). Bring a pan with about 7.5cm of water to the boil. Stand the asparagus in this, bases in the water, spears leaning against the side (they cook in the steam). Cover with a lid. Cook until only just tender, testing with a point of a knife. How long it takes depends on the thickness of the asparagus. If it's of

average thickness, I reckon on seven minutes, but I usually start checking after four. Lift the asparagus out of the pan, then quickly dry it of excess moisture by patting it with a clean tea towel.

4 Add a little of the asparagus cooking water to the pesto to loosen and thin it. Mix the extra virgin olive oil and the white balsamic vinegar together and season. Divide the asparagus, raw peas, radishes and pea shoots between six plates – or put them all on a platter – and drizzle with the white balsamic dressing. Spoon on some of the pesto and offer the rest at the table.

## SHAKING THINGS UP FOR SPRING

Want to whip some of these stylish sips up at home? You'll need a blender, Boston shaker, mixing glass, bar spoon, jigger and bags of ice. With an emphasis on freshness, flora and fauna, here's how to season your stemware for spring ...

## TANQUERAY CITRUS PUNCH

LONDON'S Dalloway Terrace have created a series of colourful cocktails for their Tanqueray No Ten supper clubs (now until June), and we love the little flourishes, such as elderflower foam, on some of the drinks. But what really kept us happy is this fuss-free, punchy concoction with Tanqueray No Ten Gin (£32.50 for 70cl, Waitrose).

» INGREDIENTS: 45ml Tanqueray No Ten, 15ml Belsazar White Vermouth, 15ml elderflower cordial, 15ml lemon juice, 15ml cucumber water, soda water. Dill for garnish.

» METHOD: Half fill a shaker with ice. Add the cocktail ingredients and shake vigorously. Strain into a tall-stemmed glass and top with soda water. Garnish with a sprig of dill.



## LAVENDER NEGRONI

A PRETTY twist on a negroni, Belvedere Pink Grapefruit Vodka (£38 for 70cl, Sainsbury's) adds a subtle blush of colour and this lighter, refreshing style is simple to create. Very 'now', the floral, zesty sweetness of the vodka is balanced by the Italian bitters and lavender spiked kombucha.

» INGREDIENTS: 40ml Belvedere Pink Grapefruit, 20ml Cocchi Americano, 10ml Italian bitter liqueur, 40ml lavender kombucha. Pink grapefruit wedge for garnish.

» METHOD: Combine all the ingredients in a mixing glass filled with ice. Stir until cold and strain into a rocks glass over a large cube of ice. Garnish with a grapefruit wedge.

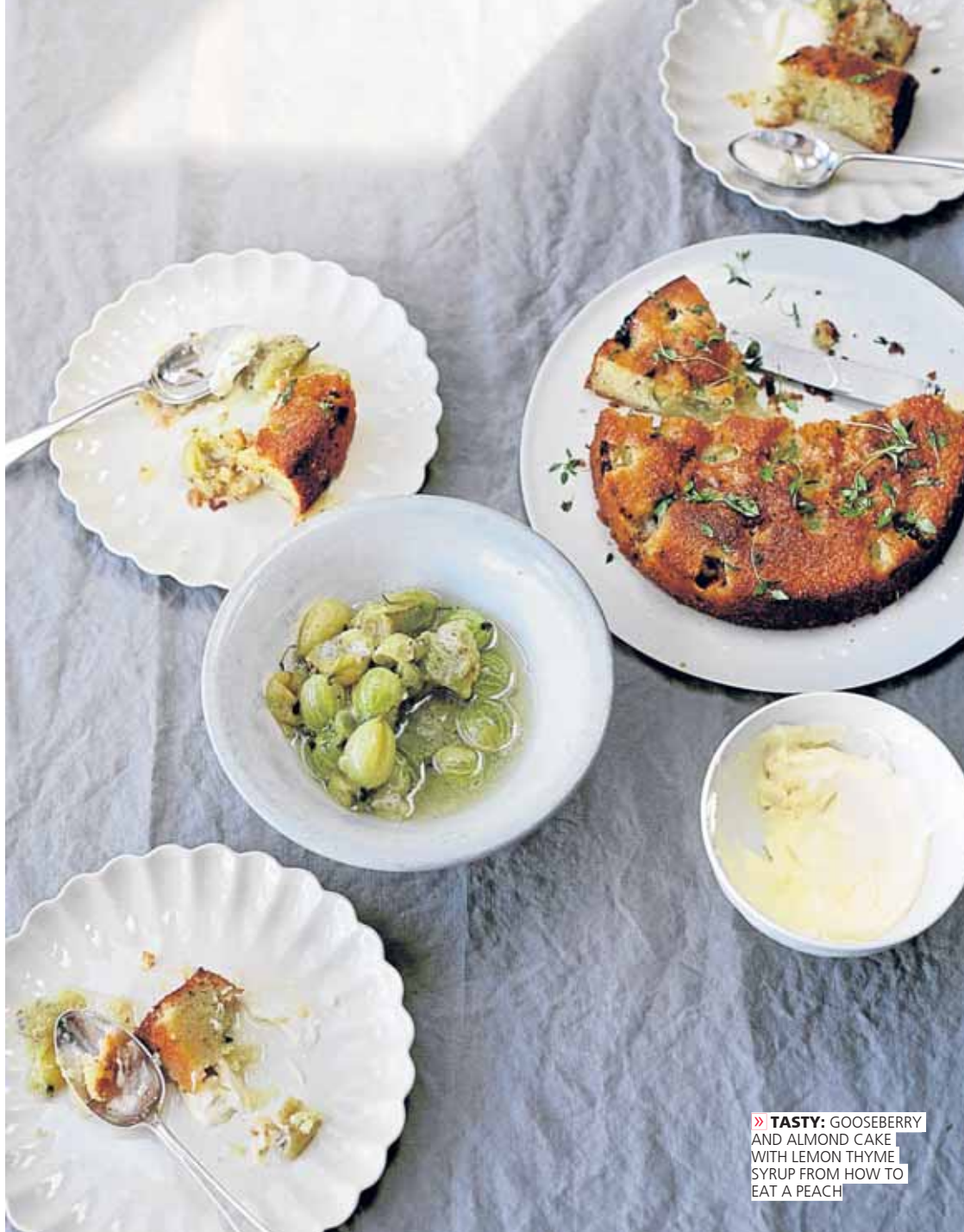


## FLOWER GARDEN

THE clever folks at The Slate love their craft spirits and have teamed up with local distillery, Aber Falls, to create this delectable infusion made with Aber Falls Violet Liqueur (£19 for 70cl, MasterOfMalt.com), a new addition to their range of whiskies, gins and liqueurs.

» INGREDIENTS: 35ml Aber Falls Violet Liqueur, 25ml lemon juice, 10ml gomme syrup, 6 basil leaves, 50ml soda water. Sprig of basil for garnish.

» METHOD: Add the basil leaves to base of a rocks glass or whisky tumbler and gently press with a bar spoon. Fill with cubed ice and add all the other ingredients. Stir, then garnish with a basil sprig alongside sip straws.

## GOOSEBERRY AND ALMOND CAKE WITH LEMON THYME SYRUP (SERVES 6-8)

## INGREDIENTS

## FOR THE CAKE:

- » 125G UNSALTED BUTTER, SOFTENED, PLUS MORE FOR THE TIN
- » 125G CASTER SUGAR, PLUS 5TBS EXTRA
- » 3 LARGE EGGS, AT ROOM TEMPERATURE, LIGHTLY BEATEN
- » 75G PLAIN FLOUR, SIFTED
- » 2TSP CHOPPED LEMON THYME LEAVES
- » FINELY GRATED ZEST OF 1 UNWAXED LEMON
- » 75G GROUND ALMONDS (PREFERABLY FRESHLY GROUND)
- » ¾TSP BAKING POWDER
- » 350G GOOSEBERRIES, TOPPED AND TAILED

## FOR THE SYRUP:

- » 4TBS GRANULATED SUGAR
- » JUICE OF 2 LARGE LEMONS
- » 2TSP LEMON THYME LEAVES

## FOR THE POACHED GOOSEBERRIES (OPTIONAL):

- » 75G GRANULATED SUGAR
- » 2 LEMON THYME SPRIGS
- » 500G GOOSEBERRIES, TOPPED AND TAILED

## TO SERVE:

- » THYME FLOWERS, IF YOU CAN FIND ANY
- » ICING SUGAR, TO DUST (OPTIONAL)
- » SWEETENED CREME FRAICHE, OR WHIPPED CREAM

## METHOD

1 Preheat the oven to 190°C/375°F/gas mark 5. Butter a 20cm springform cake tin and line the base with baking parchment.

2 Beat the butter and the 125g of caster sugar until pale and fluffy. Add the eggs a little at a time, beating well after each addition. If the mixture starts to curdle, add one tablespoon of the flour. Put the lemon thyme leaves in a mortar with the lemon zest and pound together to release the fragrance. Add to the batter and briefly mix.

3 Fold in the rest of the flour, the almonds and the baking powder, using a large metal spoon. Scrape into the tin. Toss the gooseberries with the remaining five tablespoons of caster sugar and spread over the top. Bake

for 30 minutes. The cake is ready when a skewer inserted into the centre comes out clean.

4 To make the syrup, quickly heat the granulated sugar, lemon juice and lemon thyme leaves in a saucepan, stirring to help the sugar dissolve. Pierce the cake all over with a skewer while it is still warm and slowly pour the syrup into it. Leave to cool a little, then carefully remove from the tin and put on a serving plate.

5 Meanwhile, make the poached gooseberries. Heat 175ml of water, the granulated sugar and lemon thyme together in a saucepan, stirring until the sugar has dissolved. Add the gooseberries and cook over a medium heat for four minutes, or until the fruit is soft but not collapsing (most of the berries should still hold their shape). Leave to cool.

6 Any thyme flowers you have will look lovely on top of the cake. You can leave it as it is, or dust lightly with icing sugar just before serving, with sweetened creme fraiche or whipped cream and the poached gooseberries on the side.

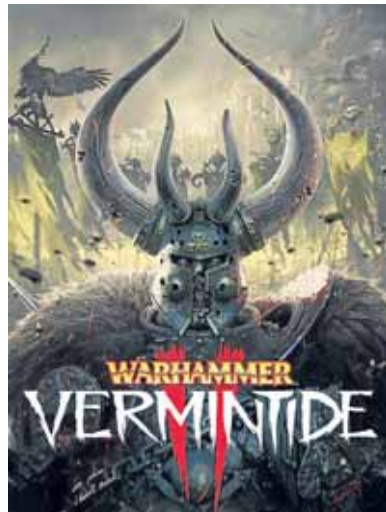
SCRIBBLENAUTS: SHOWDOWN

SCRIBBLENAUTS earned the name in its original incarnation on the Nintendo DS. But there's no stylus-aided drawing fun in this 'big console' follow-up. Instead, the vibrant cartoon style has been

wedged into a party-game shape, either through a board game mode that pits players against each other in mini-games to earn steps forward, or simply in straight mini-game 'showdowns'. Some games ask you to pick items to juggle, stack or whatever (for example, it's easier to stack crates than bananas), while others use

standard party game methods like button-bashing (blowing up balloons, for instance). There's also a free-roam mode that's like a retro Little Big Planet. Scribblenauts is charming enough but essentially just another collection of mini-games.

It's very Left 4 Dead, but it's also so much more and so very enjoyable, especially as – even in failure – you are rewarded for effort with upgrade opportunities and new equipment.

CRAMMING the movement of football into a virtual reality headset is a ridiculously difficult idea, but VRFC makes a decent go of it. Controls are challenging: Pump your fists to run, steer with your head, while there are buttons for sidesteps, sprinting, kicks and quick turns. Outside of the training mode VRFC is online only, so there's no hiding early on – but once you find a groove, the four-on-four matches make for very social gaming. Sadly, the basic look is unlikely to win admirers to boost online numbers, which will hamstring any chance of actually playing the game properly until the single-player update comes out later in the year.

FOR those who don't already know, the Isle of Man TT race is what insane motorcyclists do around a 38-mile circuit that loops the island's domestic streets and country roads. Ride On The Edge impresses mainly because it succeeds in replicating all 264 corners of the island's circuit, complete with very English hedgerows, shops and kerbs. The sensation of speed is also striking, emphasised by the narrow environment and aided by a deep selection of assists and driving difficulties. Beyond the main event, however, Ride On The Edge falters and becomes an ordinary two-wheeler.

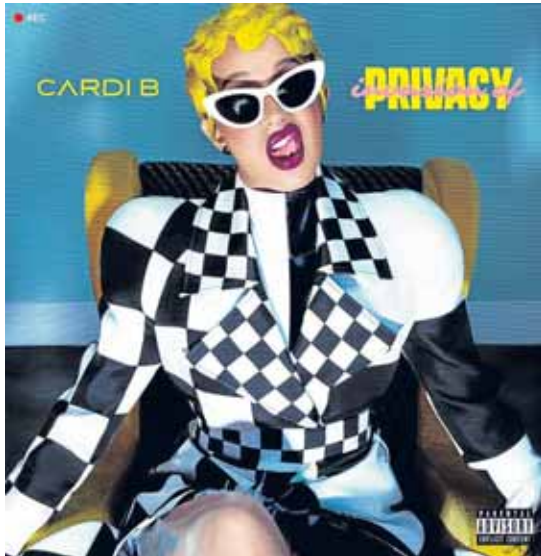

# A-GRADE EFFORT FROM CARDI B

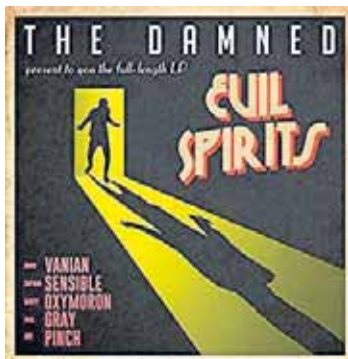
CARDI B

The BBC are very good at making shows like these – luring audiences in with a reality show-like premise but then hitting them with the history. You become invested in the characters they've selected to take part and before you know it you've absorbed a whole heap of information about Winston Churchill and the Special Operations Executive. Next week is about silent killing techniques – good luck making that a jaunty reality segment.

## IT ALL ADDS UP FOR NURTURE



THE whole debate about nature versus nurture and which side the pendulum favours will probably never be settled, but *Living With The Brainy Bunch* (BBC2) made a good argument for nurture. Two struggling pupils went to live in the homes of high achievers and had to get used to strict new regimes, including rigorous rules about homework. It made for a fascinating social experiment that hopefully all mums and dads were watching. You may not think that early bedtimes or curfews can make a great difference, but this programme seemed to suggest it all adds up.

## WILL SERIES BE LOST CAUSE?

LOST in Space was something I first encountered on Channel 4 during summer holidays. Even in the mid-80s the campy 1960s sci-fi show felt oh-so old fashioned, but at least it was entertaining (unlike the Matt LeBlanc remake in the mid 1990s). So fingers crossed the new Netflix adaptation – which started last night – is a throwback to the original.

If you haven't seen *The Island*, the survival show dumps a group of suburbanites on to a remote island in the Pacific and leaves them there for a month.

But don't expect them to be competing in challenges for food and treats à la *I'm A Celebrity* – that would be far too civilised.

On *The Island* they have literally nothing and must scavenge for everything. The pleasure comes from the fact it doesn't seem faked in the slightest – a rare thing in reality TV.

There are no teams of producers lurking off-screen ready to step in when the going gets tough. I think the health and safety officers must have gone on holiday too, because everything they do seems unbelievably hazardous.

In previous series we've seen the hapless islanders getting perilously close to starvation and, in one of the most heart-stopping sequences in reality show history, a contestant (can we call them that?) fell off a cliff and almost died.

This year's series has the added value of class warfare, as two teams of rich and poor (their words) battle it out to

see who has the best strategy for survival.

Wealthy or not, neither team has (so far) really proved themselves, with both struggling with the basics, like shelter, fire-making, hunting, food, and, well, pretty much everything.

The *Island* doesn't pompously claim that this is a sociological study or anything like that. It's simply to see how we humans survive in extreme conditions.

The answer, which has been screamed loudly from the palm tree tops for three series now, is very, very badly – and I absolutely love it!

STAR WARS EPISODE VIII: THE LAST JEDI

FORGET the whining fanboys who claim writer-director Rian Johnson has destroyed their childhood with this bold take on a Star Wars movie.

In actual fact *The Last Jedi* is the best Star Wars film since *The Empire Strikes Back*.

# THRILLER A FASCINATING TRIP BACK IN TIME FOR US

» IF YOU'RE after a good psychological thriller that gets your pulse racing, look no further than *The Alienist*.

The latest Netflix crime fix, the 10-part series – based on the award-winning novel by Caleb Carr – offers up an unflinching, turn-of-the-century murder mystery like none other.

Transported back to the underbelly of New York City's "Gilded Age", the story introduces viewers to Laszlo Kreizler (Daniel Bruhl), an obsessive "Alienist" in the controversial new field of treating mental pathologies, who holds the key to hunting down a ritualistic killer murdering young boys.

Invested, too, in the dark goings-on is newspaper illustrator John Moore (Luke Evans) and Sara Howard (Dakota Fanning), an ambitious secretary determined to become the city's first female police detective.

For both actors, it was a complex period – and mindset – to delve into.

"The 'Gilded Age' of New York City meant many things," begins Evans, 38, having done his research.

"As well as wonderful wealth and the industrial age, there was also extreme poverty and the merging of immigrants from all over the world put in this little microcosm of Lower East Side New York City."

"There were no health regulations, there were no child labour laws," continues *The Girl On The Train* star. "There was extreme corruption ... the sex industry was

rampant for many different forms of it.

"I mean, we had some moments, didn't we?" he says, turning to his Fanning. "There were scenes that Sarah and John had in a tenement, an apartment where there were 20 people living, which was absolutely accurate.

"[From] screaming babies to the grandparents all living on top of each other, it was so real, so visceral, so hot, so desperate. It was almost like a history lesson as much as it was us trying to tell a story."

Of the bleak undertones, he adds: "I mean, I've done some dark stuff in my work in the last few years but this is quite close to the top of the list.

"It's not just that it's dark, it's that

it's so close to reality and it's so extreme."

"I'm naturally attracted to darker subject matters," adds Fanning, 24. "But as we got in to it, we found so much more than that.

"That darkness, you became de-sensitised to it," she reasons. "I got lost in the world more than I usually do."

Did she make her own inquiries into the era?

"Well, I don't usually do research!" admits Fanning, with a laugh. "I just used the story that we're trying to tell, the scripts and, in this particular case, the world that was created around us.

"The set, the costumes, the extras," she elaborates. "You fit the time period and find yourself in these clothes, so it came very natural to get into the headspace."

But prising on a corset isn't a feat to be scoffed at, recalls Fanning, who

rose to prominence as a child in such big-screen hits as *I Am Sam* and *Uptown Girls*.

"I actually fainted in my first shooting!" she quips.

"I've worn corsets before for other roles, [but] it's so amazing how it changes everything about the way you sit, walk, move and breathe," she adds, praising costume-designer-to-the-stars Michael Kaplan for his "genius".

"Someone has to help you get dressed in the morning and take it off of you at night – all of those little things can be annoying but also very helpful," she says.

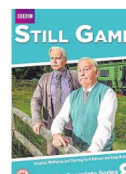
