



Dolly Parton: A Life of EATH HOPE

THE COUNTRY QUEEN'S SPIRITUALITY BRINGS HER PEACE DURING TOUGH TIMES By RON KELLY

ven though Dolly Parton's beloved **Smoky Mountains** were devastated by deadly wildfires in 2016, she knew the "mountain strong" people affected by the natural disaster would rise again. "Everybody's got that spiritual background," she said of the locals who live in the same area where she spent her humble early years. "I think that good neighbors and faith and trust in God - and in one another – helps everyone pull together as a team. You got to pull as a community; as a family. That's the only way you can keep going."

Her strong faith is what has helped the country legend, 72, pull herself through some of the toughest struggles in her own life. "I hurt like everybody else. I'm not always happy," Dolly admits, and she's faced several hurdles and heartaches through the years, including a family tragedy when she was growing up in the poverty-stricken Appalachian hills, a career-halting medical condition in the '80s and a marriage crisis with husband Carl Dean, 75, that made her briefly consider taking her own life. "A belief in God is essential," Dolly adds of how her daily prayers and trust in God have helped her through every crisis.

FINDING HER WAY

Dolly, the fourth of Robert and Avie Parton's 12 children, was surrounded by religion from an early age. "Our grandparents were Christians and our granddad was a minister. A healer, actually," sister Stella

Dolly, her siblings and a cousin in 1955, on the day her brother Larry was buried.

"We had a roof over our head, even if it did leak," Dolly says of her childhood home. "I've never been ashamed, no matter how poor we might have been," Dolly, with her mom and dad in 1987, says.

Parton, 69, tells *Closer*. "Our grandparents believed in anointing people with olive oil and praying over them if they were ill, so if we were injured, we were prayed for."

Stella, whose *Old Time Singing* gospel album was digitally released last year, says that she, Dolly and the rest of their siblings still cherish their spiritual upbringing. "It shaped Dolly into who she is today, inside and out," Stella insists. "Growing up with very little except our family connection and God meant everything. Our faith is the most important thing to all of us. It was the key to our survival."

The family shared a one-room shack in Locust Ridge, Tenn., before later moving to a small house. Times were always lean, and tragedy struck when Dolly's brother, Larry, was born when she was 9. "Since there were so many of us, my mother used to say, "This one is gonna be your baby," Dolly recalls, "and that meant you got to take extra care of it." Sadly, Larry died just four days after birth.

"This particular baby was my baby," Dolly reveals, "so there is a lot of heartache that goes on with that. But all things are hard, and that is what makes you who and what you are." Shaken by the loss, young Dolly eventually found comfort in an abandoned chapel near her home that had a dilapidated piano inside. There, her love of music blossomed, and she wrote songs on a makeshift instrument she created from some of the piano's old strings. "I would sing hymns to God," Dolly recalls, and she prayed there a lot, too.

"One day as I prayed in earnest, I broke through some sort of spirit wall and found God," she reveals of a lifealtering moment, describing her Lord as "a friend I could talk to on a oneon-one basis. The joy and the truth I found there is with me to this day. I had found God. I had found Dolly Parton. And I loved them both."

Her ongoing conversations with God have helped Dolly through more dark days, including a period in 1982 when the pain from severe abdominal bleeding forced her to seek medical attention and cancel a tour. By 1984, she underwent a partial hysterecto-

my and was told she'd never be able to have children with Carl. "It was a really bad time," she admits of sinking into a two-year depression and being forced to scale back her professional commitments. "Sometimes God just has to smack you down," she says of the message from above. "He was almost saying, 'Sit your pretty little ass down because we have to deal with some stuff!""

FACING HER DEMONS

Around that time, Dolly also wrestled with guilt over an emotional affair she had during her marriage to Carl, whom she wed in 1966. Even though her dalliance ended, she was so rattled by her feelings for another man that she found herself eyeing her gun. "I looked at it a long time. Then, just as I picked it up, just to hold it and look at it for a moment, our little dog, Popeye, came running up the stairs," Dolly says. "The tap-tap of his paws jolted me back to reality, I suddenly froze and I put the gun down."

Startled but thankful for the interruption, Dolly quickly started to pray. "I kinda believe Popeye was a spiritual messenger from God," she says, adding, "I don't think I'd have done it, killed myself, but I can't say for sure. Now that I've gone through that terrible moment, I can certainly understand the possibilities, even for someone solid like me, if the pain gets bad enough."

Having survived that trial in their marriage, Dolly and Carl are thrilled to celebrate their 52nd anniversary on May 30. Though Dolly's fame prevents her from attending services at a public church, the couple have built their own little chapel on the grounds of their farm in Brentwood, Tenn. "She spends time there most every day she's home," a friend tells *Closer*. "She not only prays there, but she often goes there to write spiritual songs. Carl goes as well, and it's their quiet place to reflect, pray and give thanks."

The duo have spent lots of time apart during Dolly's high-profile and frenetic career, as the reclusive Carl chooses to stay home — and out of the limelight. "But Dolly's in her 70s now, and she has different priorities," her friend says. "She's been home a lot these past nine months, and she and Carl have spent most of the year together. It seems to be their new norm."

What hasn't changed is their love for one another. "There's still a lot of passion between them," the friend promises. "Dolly still enjoys cooking for Carl, and he still writes her love po-

ems. Despite all their ups and downs, they both consider their relationship a match made in heaven!"


And Dolly is more confident than ever in her marriage. "She always lets God's hand guide her through life," another pal says, "and she's always come to the realization that God believes her place is with Carl." After all, as Dolly quips with her trademark wit, "We know each other so well. I know every line in Carl's face, and he knows every hair in my wig!"

THE ACCLAIMED ACTOR TALKS ABOUT HIS AMAZING CAREER AND WHY HE LEFT HOLLYWOOD WITH HIS FAMILY

JEFF DANIELS

A Man for All Genres

Jeff made his first big splash as Debra Winger's unfaithful husband in 1983's classic weeper *Terms of Endearment*.

f Jeff Daniels could give his younger self advice, here's what he'd say: "Hang on — it may not happen until you're in your 50s!" he told *Closer* at the recent Montclair Film Festival in New Jersey. While Jeff has been on a roll of late with awardworthy turns in projects like Hulu's new Sept. 11-themed miniseries, *The Looming Tower*, the truth is he's done consistently fine work since his breakout role in *Terms of Endearment* 35 years ago.

This is an even more impressive achievement considering Jeff, 63, put the bright lights of Hollywood behind him in 1986 and moved home to his native Chelsea, Mich., with his wife and high school sweetheart, Kathleen. There, they raised three now-grown kids: Ben, Lucas and Nellie. "It slows you down," Jeff tells *Closer* of life on the Lower Peninsula. "It always reminds you when you go back into a movie or a play that it's an extra dose of special."

Jeff left home after studying for three years at Central Michigan University to pursue his dream of acting, with the full support of his family. "He ran a lumber company, she was a housewife," Jeff recalls of his parents. "They saw something in this kid who could stand on a stage and know exactly what to do."

After several years of struggling, he landed his first lead role as an old-time movie star who literally steps off the big screen in Woody Allen's 1985 fantasy *The Purple* *Rose of Cairo*. "If I was good enough for Woody, I was good enough for anybody," says Jeff. "That meant I was in it for the long haul."

The film provided a name for the Michigan stage troupe Jeff started in 1991. "They just did their 100th

production," he says proudly of Chelsea's Purple Rose Theatre Company, which sometimes performs plays Jeff writes. "The town is now a destination."

SOMETHING WILD

Jeff's agents and managers tried to talk him out of co-starring with Jim Carrey in 1994's gross-out comedy *Dumb and Dumber*, but Jeff wouldn't listen. "They said, 'We're going to stop this — you're a serious actor and this will ruin your career. With all due respect, Jim is going to wipe you off the screen,'" Jeff remembers. "I said, 'If I f--- up and it's wrong, then it's my choice, but I'm getting on the plane.'"

The film was a smash and spawned a sequel, as Jeff displayed the versatility that has become his hallmark. "The theme is, don't repeat yourself," he explains of his résumé, which includes everything from family films (*Fly Away Home*) to indie dramas (*The Squid and the Whale*) to a dark Western (*Godless*). "Do something you've never done before because you think you can't. Challenge yourself."

He plans to do just that by taking on Gregory Peck's iconic film role as attorney Atticus Finch in a new Broadway adaptation of *To Kill a Mockingbird*. "I hadn't read it or seen the movie, but now I've read the book and seen the movie twice," Jeff says. "I think it's an important play, especially now."

In the meantime, he can focus on a very personal side project, the Jeff Daniels and Ben Daniels Band. "It's something I get to do with my sons — my other son, Lucas, tour manages us," says Jeff, who's written over 400 country-tinged songs and played over 300 live gigs in the last dozen years. "We look at it as a big adventure that's a lot of fun."

But Jeff is happiest at home with his family on their dock. "It's like a poor man's Kennedy compound, but it's a great place to be," he says. "We're just comfortable there." Ain't nothing dumb or dumber about that.


CHER HAS STAGE FRIGHT!

Author Sue Cameron was a college journalism major when she met Sonny Bono and Cher, before they were famous, at a local TV dance show. "As weird as I thought they looked, the girl had style," she writes in her book, *Hollywood Secrets and Scandals: The Truth Behind Stars' Closed Doors*. But when she got to know them, she discovered "Cher always felt more comfortable locked in bathrooms" because she had "terrifying, paralyzing stage fright," Cameron tells *Closer*. Cher's fear drove Sonny nuts. "He hated constantly having to beg her to come out of the bathroom," Cameron says. Even so, "Cher wanted to be a star so badly. She is so smart — street smart and she has a survival streak that is amazing." As the duo got more famous, though, "the less Cher saw of Sonny. She much preferred to hang out with her girlfriends in her bedroom," Cameron says. "Cher's bedroom always has been where she spends most of her time."

MEET THE REAL SEX AND THE CITY WOMEN

A close friend of Joan Rivers, Cameron writes emotionally about the comedian's passing in 2014. But she also reveals that "Joan, Barbara Walters, Cindy Adams and Judy Sheindlin went on many vacations together. They went to Europe, they would go to fat farms, they'd go on boats and they had a wonderful time," Cameron tells *Closer*. The funnylady, the newswoman, TV's highest-paid judge and the gossip columnist "were drawn to each other because of their minds they had brains in common and stature," Cameron explains. "It was just a girls group where they would sit and talk." What did they chat about? Dishes Cameron, "They would talk about sex — I know that, Joan told me — and who wasn't having it!"

DEBBIE REYNOLDS PLANNED TO LEAVE EDDIE FISHER!

When Eddie Fisher left his wife, *Singin' in the Rain*'s Debbie Reynolds, for Elizabeth Taylor, the scandal grabbed headlines. But Cameron reveals, "The public never knew this — Debbie wanted to leave Eddie long before Eddie ever thought about Elizabeth. She felt it was important for [their daughter] Carrie to have a sibling, so she hung on long enough for that to happen." Cameron believes the union was doomed from the start. "Debbie really believed [marriage] was for life, and he disappointed her practically from the day they got married," she tells *Closer*. "He never paid any attention to her, he just wanted to play poker with his buddies and go out on the road." After their son, Todd, was born, "Debbie was busy with the baby," Cameron says, so she hadn't yet ended things when Eddie dropped the bomb. "When he left her for Elizabeth, she was angry at him for the shame he put on the family and she was very hurt that Elizabeth, her best friend from MGM, would do that to her. She also knew Elizabeth would get tired of him and throw him out." Debbie won in the end. Says Cameron, "Debbie was

Cameron, "Debbie was America's girl scout. She always had the sympathy of the public. Always."



KIM NOVAK SAVED HERSELF

"I need to explain that there is a Marilyn Novak and a Kim Novak," Cameron says of her friend, the luminous star of *Vertigo*, who changed her name when she became an actress. Much like Marilyn Monroe, Marilyn Novak "would transform into that persona" of Kim for Hollywood. "My friend is kind and funny and bright and is so down-to-earth," Cameron tells *Closer*. "She loves to get her hands dirty working in the field with her husband and animals." But Kim, 85, had a difficult childhood with a sexually abusive father. She struggled most of her life with bipolar disorder and anxiety brought on by the abuse. But now, "Kim paints every single day," Cameron says (see inset, above). The actress left Hollywood, moved to Carmel, Calif., where she could live surrounded by nature and "she is in a 90 percent better place," Cameron says. "That takes such work with therapists and with yourself. She really saved her own life."

CAROL BURNETT'S MOST EMBARRASSING MOMENT

Friends Carol Burnett and Cameron were invited to a party at Peggy Lee's house where their idol, Cary Grant, would be. When the screen icon walked in, Carol "started to bounce up and down" on the couch, says Cameron, who started to follow Cary, but Carol remained seated. Why? "Who expects Carol Burnett to look at you and say, 'I wet my pants!" Cameron recalls laughing. "She's very honest." Cass' powerful voice made her a star!

MAMA CASS ELLIOT DIDN'T CHOKE ON A HAM SANDWICH!

For years people thought The Mamas & the Papas singer Cass Elliot, 32, died in 1974 from choking on a ham sandwich. How did that urban myth get started? Cameron explains, "It was from me writing that story that evervone wrote that [same] story." On the day her friend Cass died, Cameron volunteered to write the news article about it. "I had the phone number of the apartment where she was staying, and Allan Carr, her manager, answered. He just went, 'Oh Sue, oh Sue, you have to help me. We have to make it look like she choked on a ham sandwich,'" Cameron remembers. "There really was a ham sandwich on her nightstand. I said, 'OK, I'll do it right away.' I was in such a state of shock. I just heard his voice and I knew I had to do something." An autopsy later revealed that Cass died of a heart attack due to obesity - but the ham sandwich legend survived.

Experts say a citrus compound (*d-limonene*) works with fruit acids in the tart treat to stimulate the output of detoxification enzymes. The fruit also eases indigestion, bloat and other GI woes within a week.

Easy Ways to BOOST FOCUS

A recently identified condition is making millions of us foggy and forgetful. Here, how to outsmart it

> hen "Where did I leave my keys?" moments become

more common, it's easy to chalk it up to aging. But research has led to a new understanding of why brain function falters: Like diabetes, mental decline is linked to issues with blood sugar and insulin. This link led scientists to coin a new condition: type 3 diabetes. "Blood-sugar control is essential to brain health," says Steven Masley, M.D., author of The Better Brain Solution. "When brain cells become insulin-resistant, they can't convert glucose into fuel for the brain, causing problems like fatigue and fog." Fortunately, you can prevent - and even reverse - the condition, assures Dr. Masley. Here's how.

TRY A 10% TWEAK

Going just a smidge farther on your workout benefits memory in a big way. Exercise reduces artery plaque (a predictor of memory loss) and activates muscles to use more glucose, reducing blood sugar over time. In Dr. "I find time to work out because if my body is in good shape, my mind is in good shape." *Kelly Ripa, 47*

Masley's studies, people who upped the number of push-ups they could do by 10 percent had an 18 percent improvement in cognitive scores. If you go on a 20-minute walk, 10 percent more is just 2 extra minutes.

ENJOY THIS SOAK

People with fewer toxins in their body are three times less likely to face mental decline. Why? Toxins hinder the body's ability to process glucose. Dr. Masley's advice: "Sweat toxins out in a steam bath once or twice a week." For best results, add 5 drops of lavender essential oil to 1 tbsp. of coconut oil and stir into a hot bath. Lavender fights the oxidative stress known to slow glucose metabolism.

MEDITATE FOR A MINUTE

Managing stress is a boon to your brain. The reason: Stress produces

cortisol, which causes blood sugar to spike. But a single stress-busting mindfulness session can reduce cortisol by 24 percent and increase blood flow to the brain to sharpen focus. The daily to-do Dr. Masley advises: Inhale for five seconds, then exhale for five seconds. With each breath, recall a positive memory. Repeat six times.

SIP A SUPER SMOOTHIE

All rich-colored veggies slow braincell aging, but beets especially are all-stars. In a study in the journal *Physiology & Behavior*, subjects who sipped beet juice scored 22 percent better on cognitive tests two hours later. Dr. Masley says antioxidants in beets lower blood sugar and their nitrates boost the production of nitric oxide, a compound that increases blood flow to brain regions that process complex information.

A Garden Bouquet to BRING ON SMILES

Fresh-picked blooms have always filled us with joy. Here, easy tricks for creating a simple yet stunning springtime display

WHAT'S NEW

Designers are bringing the beauty of a spring garden to tabletops by styling classic English cottage flowers, like columbine, with other seasonal favorites for a wow-worthy bouquet. "Here, the columbine's sculptural petals create a focal point in the mixed blooms," says floral expert Deborah Pomroy Moyer. "And the simple glass vase allows the blossoms to shine."

GET THE LOOK

Fill a 5-inch-tall vase with water. Snip about a half dozen columbine stems to 6 to 8 inches. Then cut a handful of lily of the valley to the same length. Insert the lilies into the vase first, angling their leaves outward to make cradles for the columbine flowers, which you'll add next. To finish, fill in any gaps with more garden blooms, like bleeding hearts and white lobelia.

FLORIST'S SECRET

Move your bright bouquet from the kitchen table to the patio hummingbirds adore columbine since their little beaks fit perfectly inside the curved nectar-filled petals. To beckon the most winged lovelies to your arrangement, place the blooms in a red-hued glass vase, as shown. This will attract the birds' attention because they associate the color red with food.



enry Thomas has come full circle. When he wasn't becoming famous as Elliott in the 1982 classic *E.T.* and other films.

he grew up quietly on a farm in South Texas. Nearly four decades later, he moved to a farm of his own, this time in Oregon with his third wife, Anna, 46, and three kids: Hazel, 14; Evelyn, 9, and Henry III, 8. "That was always my goal. We have horses and apples and horse apples," Henry, 46, tells Closer, laughing. He's also achieved adult success with films like Legends of the Fall. "It's hard when you're remembered for an iconic role," he says. "But I'm in an industry where in order to get a job, I have to go into a room and get either rejected or accepted. If you have a thin skin, you just won't last very long." These days, Henry is keeping busy with a new Lifetime movie, Girl in the Bunker, and a Netflix series due in October, The Haunting of Hill House. The private star opens up to Closer about his childhood, marriage and why he's "enjoyed being a parent more than anything else." - Gregg Goldstein

HEART to heart

How did you get into acting?

I hated piano lessons and found if I did plays, I didn't have to take them! I was 6 when *Star Wars* came out, and it put a spark in my mind. I thought, Wow, these things we imagine can sort of be a reality. I want to do *that*.

Any favorite memory of E.T.?

Probably when we had Halloween on set. A lot of the crew dressed up, and it felt like a family day. When you're a kid in an adult work environment, it can be pretty serious. It's nice to have lightness.

Do you keep in touch with the cast?

I'm pretty good friends with Robert MacNaughton, who played my older brother. He lives in Manhattan and I see him at least once a year. He was a mentor because I don't have any siblings and he had done Shakespeare, so I would always ask him advice.

Any chance we'll see a reboot?

I don't think Steven Spielberg wants to touch it, and I know he won't let anyone else. You don't want to cheapen the original. As soon as we're all dead, I'm sure they'll revamp it. [Laughs]

BIG LESSON

What has Henry learned? "There are no guarantees. Be pleasant and live life as best you can. You have to make an effort, and you can't be complacent."

You've talked about how success turned you into a bit of a hermit.

I didn't know how to deal with the attention or fame. You kind of become a social outcast, because suddenly you're in some other category, but don't feel any different. I spent a lot of time worrying about how I was being accepted by other kids, so I reacted by keeping to myself, and I was already sort of an introvert. As I got older, I didn't let it affect me like that at all.

How did you adapt?

I thought, If I don't associate with film people and stay in my little

town in Texas, I'll be perceived as normal. Eventually you realize no one's ever going to perceive you as the guy down the street, so you just have to be yourself.

And then you moved to LA.

I said, "I'm going to buy a house there and sell it in five years." I was getting my career on track, and 20 years later I said, "Why am I still here? If I get a job, I'm always leaving town, so it's like paying to live somewhere that I didn't ever want to be."

You were married to Kelly Hill from 2000 to 2002 and Hazel's mom, Marie Zielcke, from 2004 to 2007. What did those marriages teach you?

A lot. I suppose I should have spent more time thinking and less time acting. [*Laughs*] No, I just think I wasn't grown up enough to be in those relationships. That was my fault, but it's not to say that was the only thing at fault. But now I've been married to Anna for years.

What's the best thing about being married to Anna?

We've known each other a long time. We were great friends, and I think the most valuable thing is that we're a family, and that's quite a good feeling to have when you're relatively alone in the world.

How do you keep the spark alive?

You have to nurture it. If you don't, it will die. There's no handbook. There are certainly rules. You have ups and downs, but you always try to keep your eye on the prize, and you have to listen.

Now you have kids Elliott's age!

We have a great relationship. I have to go away a lot, and that's always tough, but I'm also there a lot more than a lot of dads, so it's a trade-off. I'm just happy that I can support them with this career. It hasn't always been easy, but they have a pretty good life, I think.

What's up next for you?

I've written a fantasy novel, it's a trilogy so I'm working on the second book now. It's about a group of people enslaved by another race. I'll probably publish it in the next year.

Do you have any regrets?

I have tons, but I don't put much currency in wondering where you went wrong. I think that's quintessentially a waste of time. I'm more interested in making today count as much as I can.
