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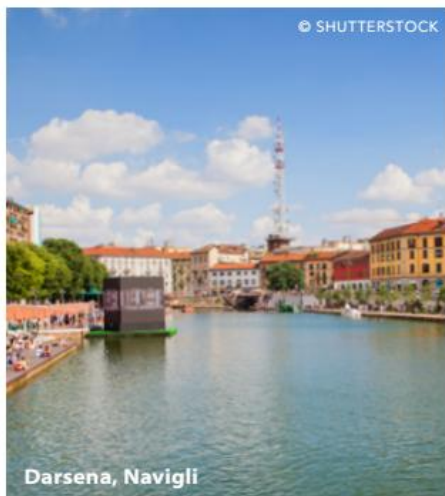

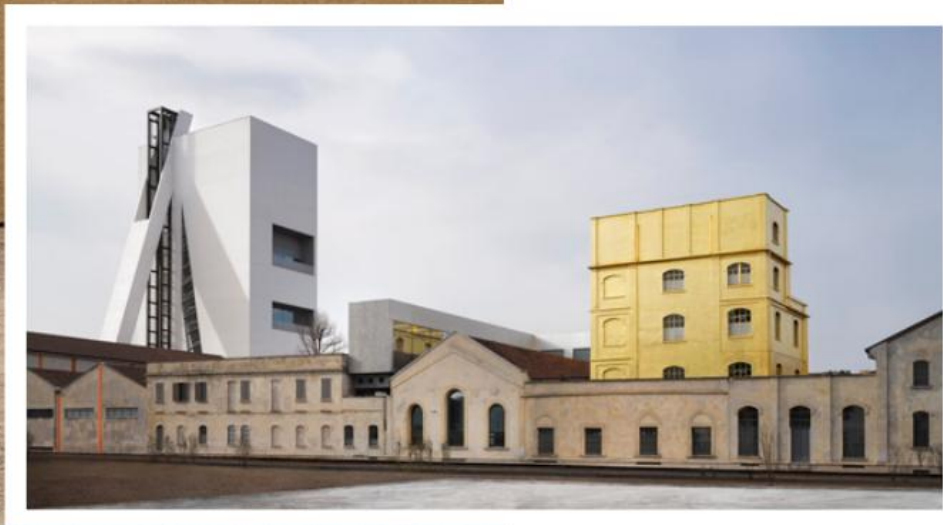

THE REDISCOVERY OF FUTURISM

“Post Zang Tumb Tuuum. Art Life Politics: Italia 1918–1943” is the evocative title of the exhibition currently showing at the **Fondazione Prada**. Curated by Germano Celant, the exhibition explores art and culture in Italy in the years between World War I and II. Over 600 paintings, sculptures, photographs, posters, architectural models and furniture shed light on the social and political context in which they were created, and subsequently interpreted by the public of that era. The **vast exhibition space** extends between the South gallery, the Deposito, the North gallery and the Podium, providing an immersive experience consisting of **24 partial reconstructions** of public and private spaces. These full-size recreations from period photographs feature original works by artists such as Giacomo Balla, Carlo Carrà, Felice Casorati, Giorgio de Chirico and Giorgio Morandi.

OnDance, a project conceived by Bolle, draws inspiration from the highly successful *Gala Roberto Bolle and Friends* (five performances will be held at **Teatro Arcimboldi** from 13 to 17 June) and will involve the whole city with exhibitions, workshops, happenings, flash mobs, urban dance performances, hip hop, musicals and meetings. Although Teatro degli Arcimboldi is the hub of Milan's dance scene, its influence can be felt throughout the city with performances hosted at unique venues and spaces including **Castello Sforzesco**, the **Arena** or the **Stazione Centrale** where a **Street Dance competition** will be held on 16 June, with the winner voted by public acclaim. The Final Show will be held on 17 June with a mega surprise party.

A part of Milan's 'Novecento Italiano' program, the exhibition titled '**Eredità della Macchia**' focuses on the artists who dedicated themselves to painting landscapes inspired by the Macchiaioli movement.

► On **Wednesday 20 June** (11 am-9 pm), **Pisacane Arte** has organized an **Auction of Modern and Contemporary Art** in collaboration with the **Lucas Casa d'Aste Milano**. The auction will feature a careful selection of **more than 300 works** by 19th and 20th century artists including Giovanni Fattori, Roberto Crippa, Andy Warhol and Salvador Dalí, as well as more contemporary masters like Mr. Brainwash and Enrico Pambianchi (a preview exhibition of the lots will be held from Thursday 14 June, from 10 am to 8 pm, at no. 36 via Pisacane).

Milan through a lens

Besides being an Italian reference point for photography thanks to several galleries dedicated to 'Auteur' photography, Milan, in itself, is a great place to take memorable photographs. Amidst monuments, 'palazzi', statues and panoramic spots, the city of the Madonnina offers endless opportunities to express your creativity.

M

ore than 50 years ago French Photographer Pierre Movila said: "A photo, it's a cardiac arrest for a fraction of a second." When

visiting Milan, you'll discover that this feeling of wonder will accompany you throughout your stay. Since you'll be spoiled for choice and probably pressed for time, Where* Milan has compiled a list of districts featuring peerless landmarks that you should capture during your stay in the city.

HISTORIC CENTRE

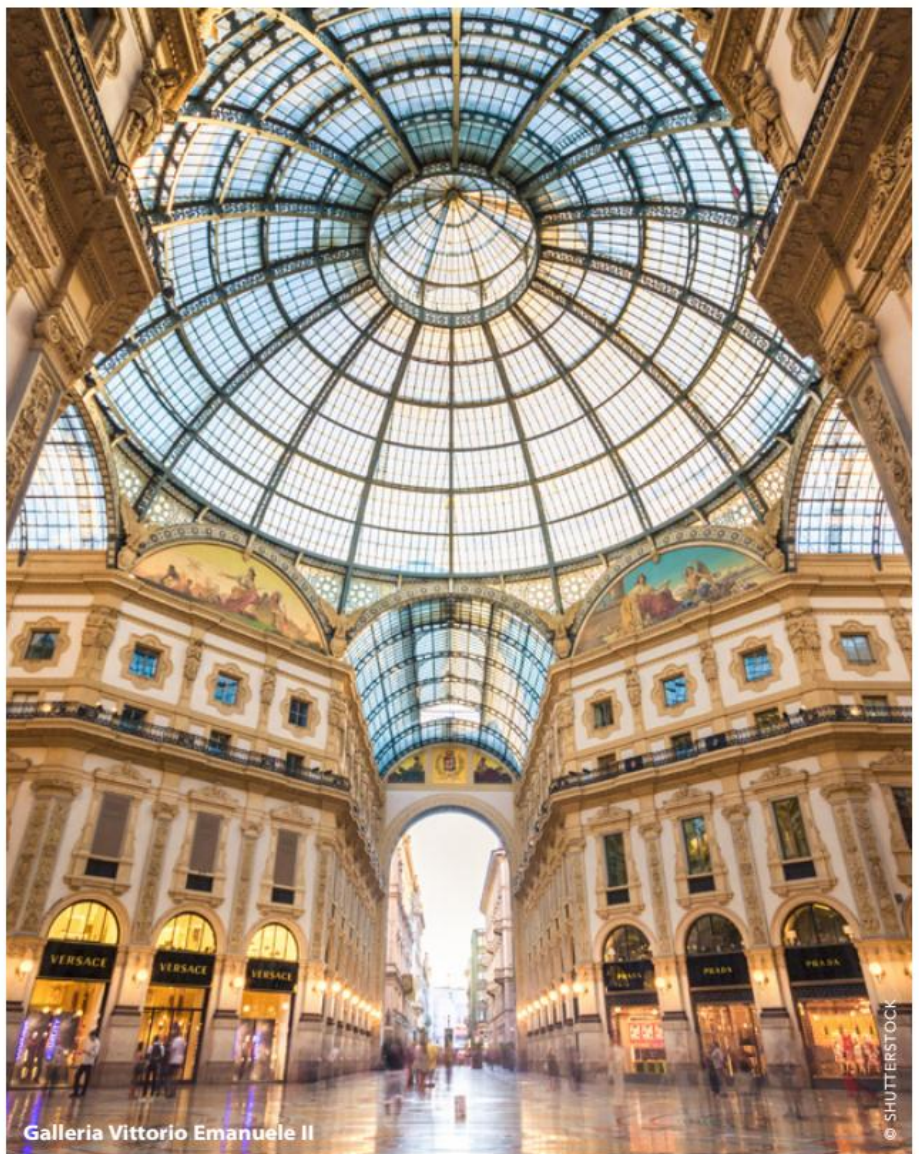
One of the most fascinating characteristics of the art of photography is its ability to capture aspects that may differ from reality, simply by moving the angle from which the photograph is taken. Working on this assumption, a shot of Piazza del Duomo, its surrounding area or the spires of the cathedral taken from the **terraces of the Duomo** is a must, especially at sunset, when the sky is tinged with different shades of red. The terraces of the Duomo can be accessed daily from 9am to 7pm, or during special openings reserved for small groups (www.duomomilano.it). A little further on, the imposing **Galleria Vittorio Emanuele II** will capture your attention with its play of lights and shadows. To get the best possible shot, don't stop in Piazza Duomo, but enter the galleria, and head towards the middle of it, preferably directly underneath its large circular dome, where its mixture of pastel-coloured walls, frescoes, vaults and glass will allow you to create the perfect photo.

Maurizio Cattelan's somewhat irreverent marble **L.O.V.E. statue** – also known as 'the Finger' – can be found in the nearby **Piazza Affari**. In addition to being one of the city's best-known works of contemporary art, L.O.V.E., the acronym of 'libertà, odio, vendetta, eternità (freedom, hate, vendetta and eternity), captures the attention of passersby due to its size and contrast with the severity of the Fascist architecture of Palazzo Mezzanotte, the headquarters of the Italian Stock Exchange, lying behind it. Stand under the arches on the other side of the square to ensure that you capture this intriguing juxtaposition of shapes and styles. If you're in search of an unconventional shot, head towards Piazza Santo Stefano and enter the **Church of San Bernardino alle Ossa**, housing the San Bernardino ossuary. At first glance, you'll notice that nearly all the decorations of its wall niches are made

from bones and skulls which are interspersed with Rococò motifs and large frescoes on the ceilings, and give the rooms a macabre yet totally captivating atmosphere. If your photographic tour of the centre has made you hungry, you can indulge in a quick break at **Iginio Massari's pasticceria** in via Marconi where each creation will delight you with its taste and stunning, highly detailed aesthetics. This display of beautiful pastries will make a great photo opportunity! (www.iginiomassari.it). From here, a short stroll through the centre will lead you to corso Venezia, the heart of **Milanese 'Liberty' architecture**. Amongst the area's various architectural treasures, you'll find **Villa Invernizzi**, an imposing Art Nouveau-style building decorated with caryatids and mosaics. Although its façade deserves more than one photo, its most noteworthy attraction can be found in its garden at the back. By peeping through the foliage, you'll find an oasis of peace inhabited by brightly-coloured pink flamingoes. A truly unusual sight in the heart of the city!

SEMPIONE AND CITYLIFE

Not far from the centre, in corso Magenta, you'll find the 19th century **Casa Rossi**, one of the Regione Lombardia's cultural assets and an architectural gem, which features a blend of **unique geometries and perspectives** that will allow photography lovers to express their creativity to the fullest. After passing its façade decorated with four superimposed tiers of windows, the main door opens out onto an octagonal courtyard, with two access points on each side. Look up and hold your lens vertically. You'll have the impression that a geometric window overlooking the Milanese sky has appeared above your head. If sculptures are among the subjects

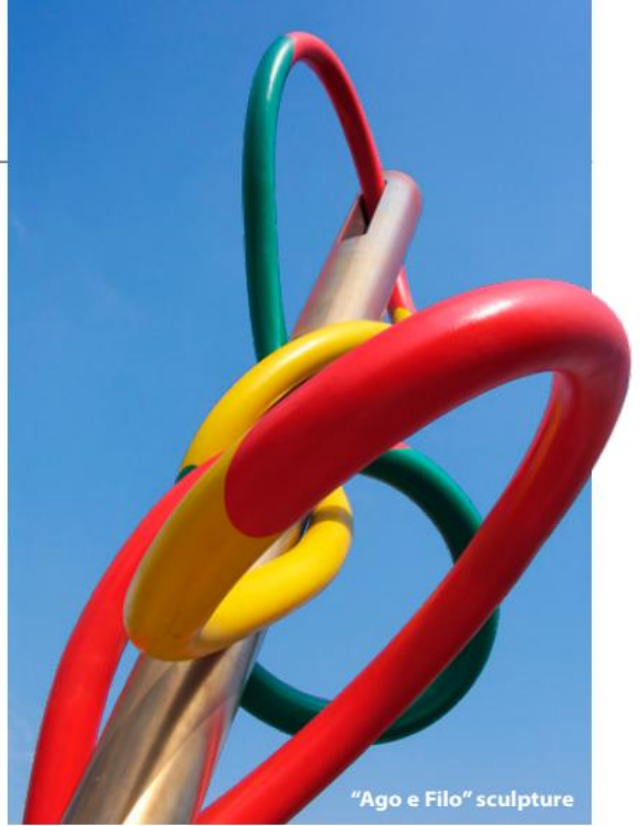

that you enjoy photographing most, then a souvenir photo of Claes Oldenburg's **Ago e Filo** (Needle and Thread) installation, located in front of the Cadorna railway station, is an absolute must. This huge artwork references the image of a train entering a tunnel but is also a tribute to Milan's Metro system. To take a picture worth remembering, photograph it in the evening, with its beautiful play of lights, or at dawn when its colours are reflected in the water below. Now head towards Parco Sempione where you'll find the **Branca Tower**, a 108 metre steel structure created by architect **Gio Ponti**. You can admire a stunning 360 degree panoramic view over Milan's skyline from its crystal viewing platform, which is also a great place to take unique pictures. By using different lenses or fisheye effects, which widen the view, you can achieve some truly surprising and creative shots (www.museobranca.it). If you don't feel like going to the top, you can head to the terrace of the nearby **Triennale di Milano** and admire the park's spaces from a different vantage point. While there, indulge in a Instagram-worthy treat at the gourmet **Osteria Con Vista** (www.osteriaconvista.it). End your photographic tour by taking a long walk to the **Piazzale Giulio Cesare**. Stand in front of the fountain, with the new design towers of the CityLife district in the background and capture the contrasting beauty of the city's past and present. Your photo will be well worth the walk.

PORTA NUOVA

The area that stretches from the Cimitero Monumentale to the futuristic Porta Nuova district offers photo enthusiasts unique

inspiration. The Cimitero Monumentale houses the **Famedio**, the vast neo-Gothic temple where several of Milan's most famous personalities, including Alessandro Manzoni and Carlo Cattaneo, are buried. While respecting this religious site, give free rein to your creativity by pointing your lens upwards,

to capture the thousand facets of light that filter through the rose windows that illuminate the building's cobalt blue and gold ceiling. Continue your tour and walk towards the imposing skyscrapers of **Piazza Gae Aulenti**. Instead of standing in the middle of the square, and photographing everything around

If, in addition to your photos, you'd like to bring home an aerial photograph of the city or a keepsake that reminds you of your visit to Milan, we recommend visiting the milano.panoramica.it website. Photography agency **Milano Panoramica** specializes in aerial views and allows you to purchase a personal license to download **high resolution digital photographs** and receive **canvas prints** of your favourite panoramic view sent directly to your home. Images of the skyline of Milan, urban landscapes, historic buildings and photographs of events, in black and white or colour, are transformed into souvenirs of a unique trip.

WHERE NOW | FOCUS

you, we suggest that you stop just beyond the steps of the Porta Garibaldi railway station. From this angle, you can take just one shot. This photo will then encompass the glass architectural structure, fitted with brass tubes that acoustically connect the various spaces of the square to the floors beneath it, and the drop-shaped opening in the ceiling, from which the spire of the **UniCredit building** rises. After crossing the square, you can stop for a regenerative break at **Bésame Mucho** and sample beautifully presented Mexican specialties, ideal for those who enjoy capturing the essence of gourmet creations in their photos (besamemucho.global). After leaving the restaurant, you can enjoy one of the most evocative views of the **Bosco Verticale** (Vertical Wood), the green residential complex designed by architect Stefano Boeri. You won't be disappointed!

Whether you're a fan of digital photography, which involves using a DSRL camera, or prefer a more practical option using your smartphone, you can take advantage of a virtual companion that will guide

you in your search for the perfect shot. The free 'Perfect Picture' App developed by Canon is available for all IOS and Android smartphones. It offers a list of unmissable city landmarks, and simple, intuitive tips to take memorable photographs.

Leonardo da Vinci's *total* experience



The exhibit Leonardo3 - The World of Leonardo allows visitors to appreciate the many sides of Leonardo da Vinci's technical and artistic work. Featuring interactive stations, fully functioning machines based on studies of Leonardo's manuscripts, unprecedented reconstructions, digital restorations and three-dimensional reconstructions of Leonardo's artistic creations, the exhibit is unique and extremely instructive. The experience of the 'Last Supper' allows visitors to investigate and discover details and colours now lost from the famous wall painting in the refectory of the church of Santa Maria delle Grazie in Milan. This is the only place in the world where visitors can see a reconstruction of the 'Last Supper' as it was 500 years ago when Leonardo painted it, offering them a chance to see all the colours and details that were irreparably lost, providing viewers with a better understanding of the original.

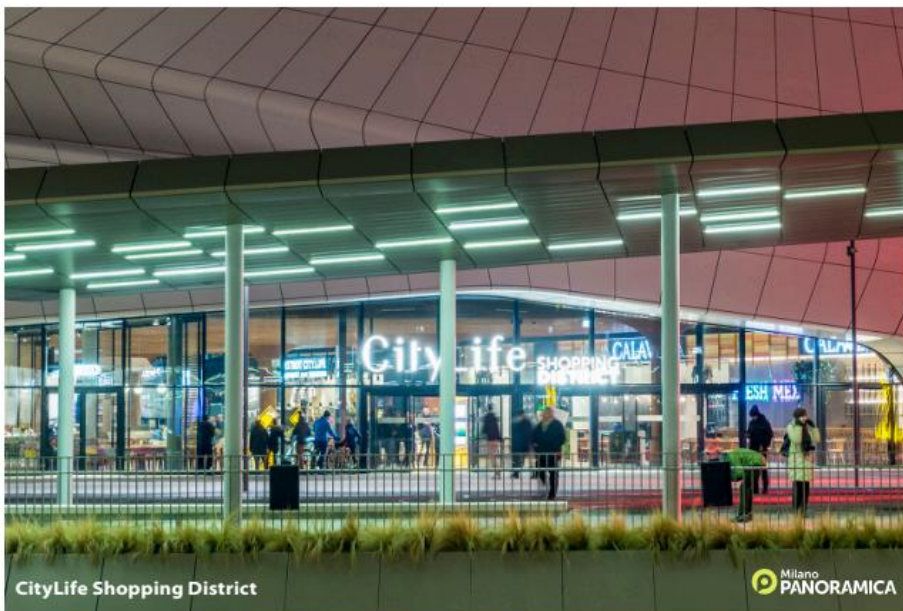

UnionPay is an international bankcard association based in China and serves the world's largest cardholder base. Some menus include the word "coperto", a small surcharge corresponding to the cost of the service and bread. Although no dress code exists in Italy, semiformal clothing is usually considered de rigueur at restaurants. All restaurants and bars are non-smoking unless a separate smokers' area is specifically offered. Set meals: prices are per person and usually refer to a 3-course meal (beverages excluded).

Tax Free Refund Guide

1. VAT (in Italian: IVA) is a **value added tax** on goods and services, and is part of the European Union's value added tax system.
2. In some cases, travellers may be granted a **VAT refund**. This refund does not cover the services supplied by hotels, restaurants, taxis or agencies.
3. You may be eligible for a VAT refund provided that:
 - you are a **non-EU resident**;
 - the goods purchased are intended for **personal or family use** only and are carried in your luggage;
 - the overall value of the goods purchased exceeds **154,94 Euro** (VAT included);
 - the purchase is certified by an **invoice**. This invoice should include a description of the goods purchased, your personal information as well as the details of your passport or any other equivalent document;
 - the goods leave EU territory by the end of the **third month** after the month that you bought them;
 - several specific customs formalities are complied with;
 - the invoice is **returned to the Italian retailer** within four months after the purchase was made.
4. The goods purchased and the relevant invoice must be **shown at the customs** exit point when leaving EU territory (if you intend to pack the purchased items into your check-in luggage, you must go to Customs **BEFORE checking in**).
5. After leaving EU territory, the traveller must **return the original invoice**, regularly endorsed by the customs office, to the Italian retailer. Said invoice must be returned within four months from the date when the document was issued.
6. The refund can be made **directly by the Italian retailer** (however, make sure that the shop you've chosen displays a "Tax Free Shopping" or "Euro Tax Free" sign in its window).
7. Several **Tax-Free companies are able to offer immediate VAT cash refunds** when the goods leave either Italian or EU territory (thus exonerating the passenger from having to return the invoice to the retailer). However, this procedure only applies at major international airports or main border crossings. **Most major department stores have Tax Free Refund offices.**
8. The services provided by Tax-Free companies imply the payment of a small administrative sum which is **directly deducted** from the amount of VAT refunded to the traveller.
9. In the event of a traveller not receiving a VAT refund within a reasonable period of time, he or she should re-contact the Italian retailer or one of the aforementioned companies.
10. However, please note, VAT cannot be refunded directly by customs offices.

PISACANE ART DISTRICT



The elegant historic **Porta Venezia** district is one of Milan's most interesting and famous neighbourhoods. Renowned for its **Liberty or Italian Art Nouveau** architecture, this area is home to late-Nineteenth century palaces characterized by their sinuous lines, majestic houses embellished with stuccoes, tiles and decorative wrought-iron elements and houses painted in bright colours. The district takes its name from the so-called 'Venice Gate' built within the city's walls. Until 1860, the gate was known as the 'Porta Orientale' (Eastern Gate) because it was

used to welcome those entering Milan from the eastern side of the city. Imbued with historical references, this area was mentioned by renowned Italian writer and poet Alessandro Manzoni in reference to Renzo Tramaglino, one of the protagonists of 'The Betrothed'. In 1842, not far from here, the '**Bagni di Diana**', the first luxury public swimming pool in Milan and Italy, was erected in the space that now houses the Hotel Diana Majestic. Between 1923 and 1926, a service centre for travelers and citizens called the **Albergo Diurno**

Venezia was constructed in a space located beneath piazza Oberdan. In 2015, FAI - Fondo Ambiente Italiano (the Italian National Trust), funded a project to restore this gem of **Art Nouveau** architecture.

MERGING HISTORY, CULTURE AND ART

The **Pisacane Art District**, home to numerous art galleries and antique shops, is located in this area between **via Carlo Pisacane** and **via Nino Bixio**. Here, you'll find an array of **art galleries, stores** and **antique dealers** catering to all tastes. In addition to exhibiting artworks, these venues sell furnishing accessories, collector's items, exquisite furniture, paintings, sculptures and contemporary design works. Besides the above, this district is also packed with elegant restaurants and shops. A prime example is the area's nearby **Corso Buenos Aires**. Considered the longest shopping street in Europe, it boasts one and a half kilometers of window displays with over 250 shops for all budgets.

The beauty of contrast

The spaces of Fondazione Prada have been enhanced and completed by the long-awaited Torre, an innovative multifunctional tower building designed to showcase contemporary art. By **Giulia Minero**

In terms of numbers, the new Torre has all the credentials to amaze: a **60 metre high tower featuring nine levels**, each boasting a distinctive character. The building is a prestigious exhibition space, and is a unique feat of architecture consisting of contrasting elements and parts. As visitors ascend the building, the floor plan changes from trapezoidal to rectangular, in a fascinating sequence of shapes that echoes the increasing size of the ceilings. The facade of the building stems from a combination of white structural concrete, a key element of the entire architectural project, and glass, where the irregular layout allows light to reach the gallery spaces from all directions, highlighting the spaces within and the artworks displayed. **Torre** completes the exhibition headquarters of the Foundation designed by Studio OMA's Rem Koolhaas, Chris van Duijn and Federico

Pompignoli, and a panoramic elevator connects it to the adjacent spaces of the Deposito via a diagonal structure made of iron and concrete. Six of the building's new floors host '**Atlas**', a project resulting from a dialogue between Miuccia Prada and Germano Celant. It features **works created between 1960 and 2016** by internationally acclaimed artists like Jeff Koons, Edward Kienholz, William N. Copley, Damien Hirst and Carsten Höller, and is curated with the aim of challenging the architectural spaces and the surrounding landscape in a play of balanced assonance and disruptive contrasts. The seventh floor houses the **Torre restaurant** that contains original pieces from the Four Seasons Restaurant in New York, juxtaposed with sculptures, ceramics and installations by stellar contemporary artists. The tower's last surprise is the rooftop **terrace**. Conceived as a multi-functional space,

it includes a bar area, where, thanks to a play of light and reflections, visitors can admire a **360-degree view over the city**.

Dream lakes

Lying North of Milan, each year the lakes of Lombardy attract millions of visitors thanks to their mild climate, breathtaking scenery, natural beauties and historic and artistic treasures.

The shores of **Lago Maggiore** wash up on the banks of Piedmont and Lombardy in Italy, while its more austere northern basin lies in the mountainous region of Switzerland. The most famous island, lying just off **Stresa** – a small, elegant town, rich in neoclassic and liberty buildings and a shopping mecca boasting a myriad of boutiques – is **Isola Bella**, anchored like a fantastic ship-garden and dominated by the majestic Palazzo Borromeo, built in the 17th century and rich in art treasures, including the private collection of Milan's most famous aristocratic family.

The Borromeo clan also owned **Rocca di Angera**, an imposing fortress (12th-17th century) boasting opulent ambiances, of which the most famous is the Sala di Giustizia. The "Rocca" also has a medieval garden (Visits daily from 9am-5.30pm. www.isoleborromeo.it). The new "Lago Maggiore Express" now also offers daily excursions by train and boat from Milan (www.trenord.it/it/free-time).

Lake Como is the romantic and worldly older

sister of Maggiore and Garda and takes its name from the city of Como. "Must-visit" sights include the Gothic Duomo, the Romanic basilicas of San Fedele and Sant'Abbondio and the neoclassic **Villa Olmo**. Nestling on the banks of Lake Como in Lenno and currently owned by FAI – a private non-profit trust – **Villa del Balbianello** is a magnificent example of a perfectly preserved 18th century dwelling. Surrounded by a stunning, terraced panoramic garden, with a breathtaking view of the lake, the Villa is one of the area's most romantic retreats. Standing on the tip of a promontory overlooking the waters of the lake, the Villa was chosen by director George Lucas as one of the evocative settings for the famous Star War series. Lying just a stone's throw northwest of Como is **Cernobbio**, a small fashionable resort frequented by the wealthy of Europe because of its deluxe hotel **Villa d'Este** and **Villa Erba** where director Luchino Visconti spent his childhood (www.villaerba.it). Continuing North, we find **Isola**

Comacina a jewel of art and nature, rich in Mediterranean vegetation and one of the most important archaeological sites of the dark ages in Northern Italy (www.isola-comacina.it). In nearby Tremezzo, don't miss a visit to the Baroque-style **Villa Carlotta**, featuring an Italian garden and sculptures by Canova. At the junction of the southern arm of the lake lies **Bellagio**, also referred to as the pearl of Como, set in a strategic position to soak up the panorama.

Don't miss a visit to the other lakes that are also easily accessible from Milan.

These include **Lake Orta**, with the old Island of San Giulio, dominated by the Romanesque basilica, the Palazzo Vescovile and the monastery (by car from Milan: take the A26 autostrada and exit at either Borgomanero or Arona). Situated just moments from the lake, we find the UNESCO world heritage site of Sacro Monte di Varallo (16th century) with its magnificent basilica and reconstruction of the life of Christ in 45 chapels.

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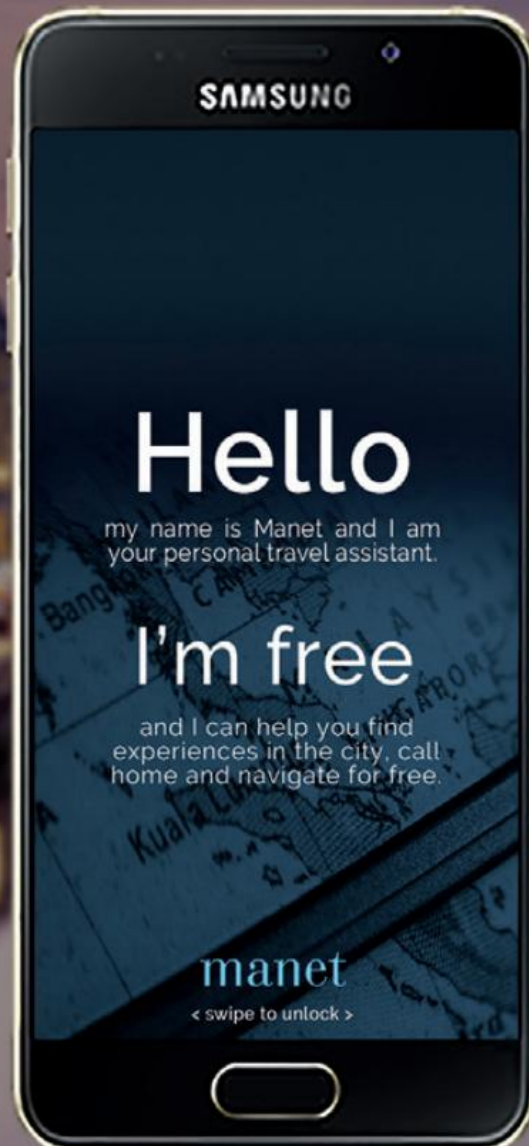
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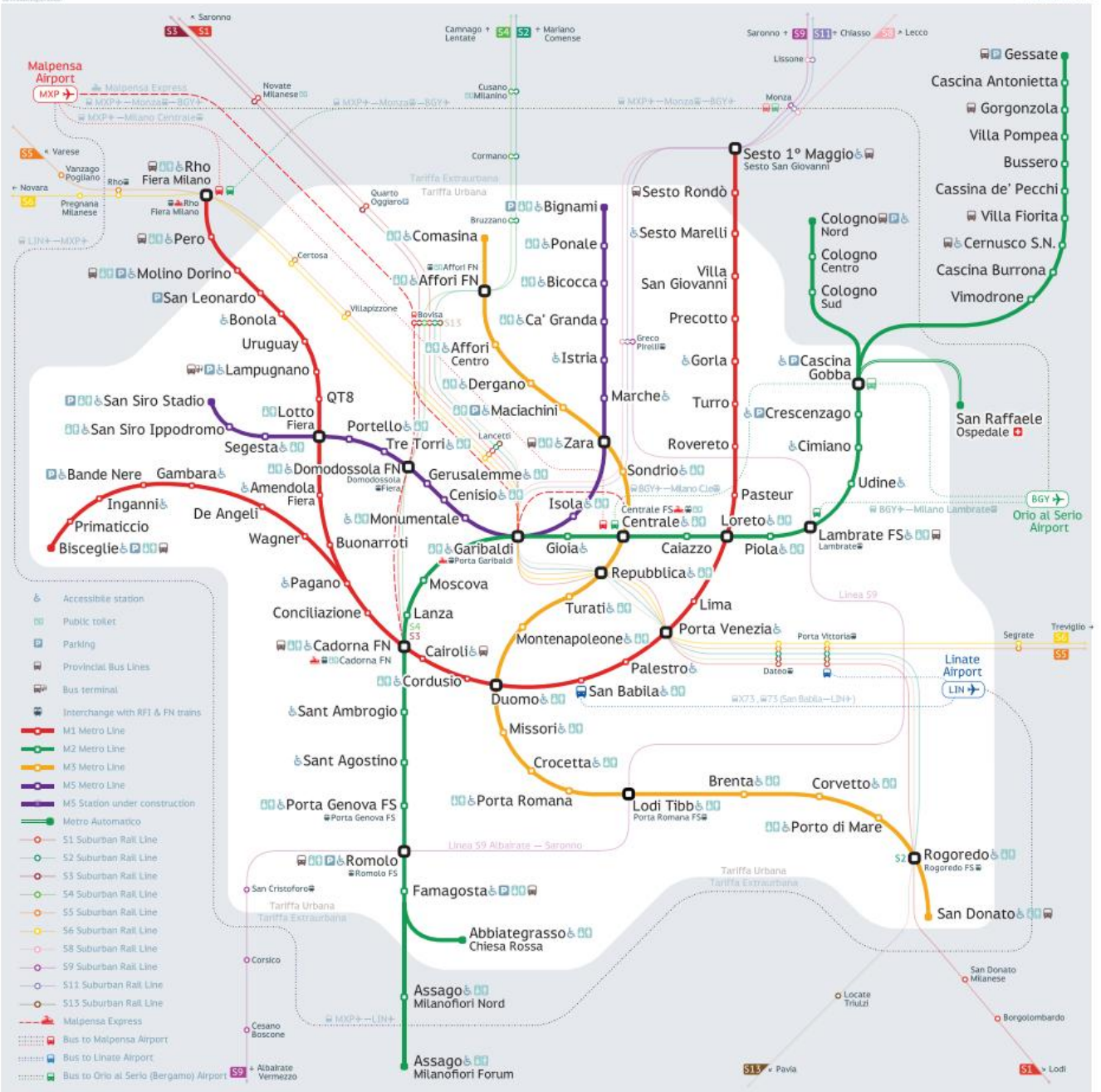

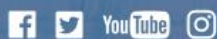
