But the hardworking former pop star admitted struggling to juggle the demands of her work, four children and husband, saying: 'I try really, really hard. I try hardest to be the best mother.'


However, it's been revealed the pair – who have shared the same management for two decades – now have separate teams. And while she gushes about David on social media, he's keeping quiet.

And her father also relayed private details about Harry's political views while they spoke on the phone, when Harry called him to ask for Meghan's hand in marriage.





With Karl's eye-watering, six-million-dollar contract thought to be coming to an end in just a few months, network bosses have been left scrambling to save the future of their failing breakfast show.

'They never really expected it to come to this,' a source tells New Idea.

'But with one PR disaster after another – his on-air rants,

messy divorce and the leaked Uber phone conversations – ratings have plummeted, and something has to change.'

Emergency meetings have been called by the network to consider every possible scenario after Karl's rant on the Logies last week, where he took aim at Channel Seven who he claimed would not be flying their top talent, including *Sunrise* presenters Sam Armytage and David Koch, to the Gold Coast in an extraordinary on-air tirade.

'I hear our opposition isn't coming this year,' he said in the controversial on-air tirade.

'What, they're too good to support the local industry? To

support their own colleagues who have been nominated for their hard work?

'Well, we don't want you there anyway. You're all boring!'

The father-of-three was labelled a hypocrite when in September last year he claimed he would 'boycott' the Logies after the Victorian government said they were withdrawing its bid to host this year's event.

'I'm telling you right now if the Logies move from Melbourne. I will not be going,' he said at the time.

However, it seems now the 43-year-old has changed his

Q: You're looking better than ever, do you find with age we become more confident in our own skin? Kerri-Anne: Yes, it's true you do! 

# LONDON TERROR ATTACK SU

t all happened so fast. One moment Candice Hedge and her boyfriend Luke were serving food and drinks at a local restaurant, the next, panicked customers were fleeing in fear.

'It was chaotic. All I could think was: "I don't want to die," Candice, 35, tells New Idea of the night armed terrorists caused mayhem on the streets of London.

Eight people died that fateful night on June 3 last year, and the Queensland native was one of the 48 injured in the attack. A year on, Candice credits her positive outlook and strong relationship for helping her through the darkest time in her life.

'Life is so short,' Candice says in an exclusive interview from London. We need to stop thinking about our differences and focus on the future.'

Candice first moved to London two years ago, after falling in love with British-

> born Luke, 28, while he was travelling around Australia.

'Luke's visa was coming to an end and so it was a no-brainer. It was either I say goodbye to him or move over to the UK and try something new in London,' she explains.

The pair found work at Elliot's Cafe, a restaurant situated iust a stone's throw from London Bridge.

We were both working on the night and it was actually a

great evening until it happened. All of a sudden, people just started heaving into the restaurant,' Candice recalls.

'It was chaotic, no-one really knew what was going on, but before I knew it, I could see the terrorists out on the front.'

Luke had begun to usher customers into the basement kitchen but, from the other side of the restaurant. Candice didn't think she would make it in time and, in that moment, she made a snap decision.

'I could see Luke standing in the stairwell waiting for me, but I knew that if I ran over to him the attackers would see

clutched her neck and fled downstairs to Luke.

'I was terrified, but it was so surreal. I'd watched one of the customers get stabbed in the back and all of a sudden, it was me.'

In huddled silence, the pair hid under the restaurant until the police arrived, petrified the attackers would return.

'In the moment I was just trying to keep my eyes open. There was no other option. I was sat there scared for my life and vomiting up blood, but the only thing in my head was: "Please just stay awake."

Candice says she won't allow what happened to define her.

'I think I went back a little too soon so I gave myself a bit of time, but now I'm back fulltime at Elliot's Cafe and Luke is starting there this week. We're both so excited to be back, we didn't really want to leave in the first place. I don't want the

#### AFTER A FIVE-DECADE SEARCH FOR HER BIOLOGICAL DAD, CARA WAS IN FOR A SHOCK

or almost fifty years,
Cara Jane Farrar
Peterson dreamed of
finding her real father.

But the mum-ofseven never thought it would happen because of her complicated upbringing.

Her mother was married six times and hospitalised with a mental-health disorder during her early teens, meaning Cara was taken into care with her older sister Mel.

'I always felt like a lost soul,' Cara, now 52, admits.

But in 2015, a chance turn of events not only allowed Cara to find her biological dad, but revealed she had secret half sister – a woman who had, incredibly, been her childhood best friend.

Cara and Karen Smith, 51, were inseparable at school, but lost touch when Cara moved away. However, the pair reconnected on Facebook in 2015 and Cara noticed something odd. Both their profile pictures looked eerily similar. It spurred Cara on to see if the two might

possibly be related. Cara's son, Mason, helped by securing Cara's official birth certificate, on which her father's name was listed as 'Christopher Archer'.

Unconvinced this was really the case, Cara agreed to appear on UK chat show *The Jeremy Kyle Show* to take a free DNA test. The results revealed something astounding.

Cara's DNA matched with Karen's dad, Michael Farrar!

'It's just an indescribable feeling,' Cara says of the shock discovery. 'It's been difficult and I've missed out on a lot of things with Karen. It's just changed who I am... and I finally feel like I belong somewhere.'

The delighted mum now thinks she and Karen 'always had a connection, even though we didn't know we were actually sisters'. Revealing how difficult it was not knowing who her true father was for so long, Cara said: 'I've never had an identity, I've never had a birth certificate or really known where I came from. No-one knew who I was. DNA wasn't around... It was different times.

'I felt like an alien... and that's what I would tell people.' Cara's newfound biological father Michael, 75, says he'd been told by her mother in 1966 that he was not Cara's dad, but is overjoyed at the news.

Now the family are relishing the chance to reacquaint. 'I missed out on Karen's wedding and other family events,' Cara muses. 'I have loads more nephews now. I just feel like after 52 years I finally know who I am — it's changed my whole life.'

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








## HETRIED TO MURDER ME... TWO VICTORIA'S CRUMBLING MARRIAGE WAS ALMOST THE DEATH OF HER



ictoria Cilliers was still bleary-eyed from sleep as she made her way downstairs one morning – only to be hit by the unmistakable smell of gas.

It was coming from a valve in the kitchen cupboard – right next to the oven – so Victoria texted her husband Emile, who was already at work.

He replied suggesting she see if the stove was working.

Things had been tense between them for a while, so in a bid to lighten the mood, she tapped out a cheeky message to sign off: 'Are you trying to kill me?'

'Seriously, why are you saying that?' he replied, adding he was

coming straight home.

Opening all the windows, Victoria didn't really believe her husband was trying to hurt her.

'I just thought it was one of those things,' she tells New Idea.

Yes, Emile had his flaws. But he would *never* harm her or their two young children. Or so the UK mum thought...

They'd first fallen in love five years earlier when former army captain and skydive instructor Victoria was working as a physiotherapist.

Emile was a sergeant in the army and he sought treatment from the 42-year-old after he was injured during a skiing trip.

The lovebirds married a year later in South Africa, Emile's home country. By that time,

Miraculously, Victoria survived after landing on a soft patch of freshly ploughed field. But she'd suffered horrific injuries, including a shattered pelvis, many broken ribs and a punctured lung.

'It wasn't until I returned home two weeks later, that I noticed how strange and cold Emile was behaving. He seemed annoyed to have me home,' she says. Victoria assumed it was shock – until two police officers turned up and told her Emile had been arrested.

'I told them every detail of the dive, hoping to convince them of Emile's innocence.

'But when I explained that he'd been alone with my parachute when he'd gone to the toilet, they seemed to pause,' Victoria explains.

Police investigations had revealed sordid messages between Emile and a woman called Stefanie Goller, who

But all of a sudden, everything started to make sense to Victoria.


'I thought back to the texts and the receipt I found. I was devastated. The man I loved had betraved me.

'The months that followed were a living hell. I hated Emile for what he'd done to me, but still couldn't believe he'd try to kill me,' she says.

However, the police thought otherwise - suspecting the gas leak was an attempt by Emile to cause an explosion when his wife lit the stove.

The 38-year-old, who was released on bail and banned from contacting Victoria, was charged with two counts of attempted murder, among other offences.

The first trial failed to reach a verdict. But in May this year, Emile Stolz Cilliers - described by the prosecution as a 'charmless, unfaithful, penniless scoundrel' - was found guilty of



in prison – to serve a minimum of 18 years - on June 15.

Victoria is still reeling. She told Good Morning Britain recently: 'I'm struggling to accept he tried to kill me. It's such a massive thing to accept.


'It's hard to conceive someone so close to you would want to cause you some kind of harm.

'I never had any indication that there was another side to him.

'I hope he didn't hate me. I really don't know.

'I love the husband I had and I'm grieving for that marriage.'

Although her ordeal was harrowing, Victoria added: 'He was a kind and loving husband."



'We can buy lambs by the half or whole. For red meat, we don't pay over \$10 per kilo. For that, it's fully butchered and we tell them how many serves we want.'


The Clarke family buy household staples from Aldi and always keep a well-stocked pantry.

potato to keep warm.

**6** Skim excess fat from top of liquid in bowl. Transfer liquid to a large saucepan. Bring to boil. Boil for about 12 minutes, or until reduced by half. Pour into a heatproof jug.

7 Meanwhile, make gremolata. Combine all ingredients in a bowl. Season.

8 Serve potato topped with lamb. Pour over sauce. Sprinkle with gremolata. Serve with lemon wedges.

### Beef in Mustard Pepper Gravy with Potatoes and Carrots

Serves 8, Prep 25 mins, Cook 7 hours, 30 mins

4 large carrots, trimmed, peeled 500g baby red potatoes

8 pickling onions, peeled, halved

4 cloves garlic, peeled

2 sprigs fresh rosemary

2 x 1kg beef blade roast

2 x 160g sachets Gravox Pepper and Shiraz liquid gravy

¼ cup wholegrain mustard

2 beef stock cubes (10g each)

2 tblsps cornflour

2 tblsps water

Steamed green beans, to serve

1 Cut carrots in half lengthways, then in half crossways.

**2** Combine carrots, potatoes, onions, garlic and rosemary in the removable

bowl of a 5 to 6-litre capacity slow cooker. Top with beef.

**3** Combine gravy and mustard in a jug. Whisk well. Pour over beef. Add stock cubes. Cover with lid.

**4** Cook on Low for about 7 to 7 hours and 30 minutes, or until beef is tender. Remove beef and vegetables from bowl. Cover to keep warm.

**5** Pour cooking liquid into a large saucepan over a high heat. Stir in cornflour blended with water. Bring to boil, stirring for about 1 to 2 minutes, or until thickened. Pour gravy into a serving jug.

**6** Serve beef with carrots, potatoes, onions and steamed beans. Drizzle with gravy.



#### Curried Sausages with Mash and Peas

Serves 6, Prep 15 mins, Cook 6 hours

1.6kg thick beef sausages (12)
4 stalks celery, sliced
4 carrots, peeled, sliced
2 onions, halved, thinly sliced
2 cloves garlic, crushed
1½ tblsps mild curry powder
2 tblsps plain flour
3 cups beef stock
1⅓ cups apple sauce
2 tblsps tomato paste
Mashed potato and steamed peas, to serve


1 Place sausages, celery, carrots, onions, garlic and curry powder in the removable bowl of a 5 to 6-litre capacity slow cooker. Toss to combine.

2 Whisk flour with ½ cup of the stock in a large jug. Add remaining stock, apple sauce and tomato paste. Whisk until combined. Pour over sausages.

Cover with lid.

3 Cook on Low for about 6 hours, or until sausages are cooked and sauce is slightly thickened. Remove sausages. Cut into 3cm pieces. Return to slow cooker. Stir to coat.

**4** Serve with mashed potato and steamed peas.

Marshmallow Weetbix Slice

Serves 24, Prep 15 mins, Cook 12 mins

- 4 Weetbix, crushed
  1 cup self-raising flour
  1 tblsp cocoa powder
- 1/2 cup desiccated coconut 1/2 cup brown sugar, firmly packed
- 150g unsalted butter, melted
  1/4 cup raspberry jam
  Extra 1/4 cup desiccated coconut
  Pink food colouring, to tint

#### TOPPING

1 tblsp powdered gelatine 3 cup water 1 tsp vanilla extract

1 Grease an 18cm x 28cm

1 cup caster sugar

- 1 Grease an 18cm x 28cm rectangular slice pan. Line base and sides with baking paper, extending paper 3cm above pan edges.
- 2 Combine Weetbix, flour, cocoa, coconut and sugar in a large bowl. Stir in butter until well combined. Press mixture firmly over base of prepared pan.
- 3 Cook in a moderate oven

- (180C) for about 12 minutes, or until golden. Remove. Cool. Spread evenly with jam.
- **4** Meanwhile, place coconut in a snap-lock bag. Add 2 to 3 drops of colouring. Seal. Rub coconut through plastic to tint.
- **5** To make topping, sprinkle gelatine over 1/3 cup of the water in a small heatproof jug. Stand jug in a saucepan of simmering water. Stir until gelatine is dissolved. Remove jug from pan.
- 6 Place sugar and remaining

water in a large bowl of an electric mixer. Beat on high speed for 4 minutes. With motor on a medium speed, gradually add gelatine in a thin, steady stream. Beat on high speed for a further 8 minutes, or until thick and fluffy. Beat in vanilla.

We used a planetary mixer with a whisk attachment to make topping. For a change, replace tinted coconut with melted dark chocolate. Drizzle over

marshmallow topping.

- **7** Spread topping over jam. Sprinkle with pink coconut. Stand until set.
- **8** Lift slice from pan. Cut into squares.

#### Lemon Pistachio Slice

Serves 18, Prep 30 mins, Cook 20 mins

125g unsalted butter, chopped, at room temperature 1/4 cup caster sugar 1 tsp vanilla extract 11/4 cups plain flour 11/2 cups icing sugar mixture 2 tblsps lemon juice 1/4 cup chopped pistachios

#### FILLING

75g unsalted butter, at room temperature 1/2 cup caster sugar 3 eggs 1 tsp finely grated lemon rind

1/4 cup lemon juice

1/2 cup desiccated coconut 2 tblsps plain flour

1 Grease an 18cm x 28cm rectangular slice pan. Line base and sides with baking paper, extending paper 3cm above pan edges.

2 Beat butter, caster sugar and vanilla in small bowl of an electric mixer until pale and creamy. Stir in flour until combined. Press evenly over base of prepared pan. 3 Cook in a moderate oven (180C) for about 12 minutes, or until light golden. Remove. Stand for 10 minutes.


4 Meanwhile, make filling. Beat butter and sugar in same, clean bowl of electric mixer until pale and creamy. Beat in eggs, one at a time, until combined. Stir in rind, juice, coconut and flour. Pour

over base. Spread evenly.

5 Return slice to moderate oven. Cook, for about 20 minutes or until filling is set and light golden. Remove.

6 To make icing, place sugar in a bowl. Stir in enough juice to form a smooth, thick consistency. Spread over warm slice. Sprinkle with pistachios. Refrigerate until set.

**7** Lift slice from pan. Cut into bars.



#### Apple and Almond Kuchen Slice

11/3 cups self-raising flour 1 cup almond meal (100g) 1/2 cup caster sugar 125g unsalted butter, melted 2 tsps vanilla extract 385g can sliced apple pie fruit, drained 1 tsp cinnamon sugar

#### TOPPING

300ml carton sour cream

1 egg

1 tblsp caster sugar

1 Grease an 18cm x 28cm rectangular slice pan. Line base and sides with baking paper, extending paper 3cm above pan edges.

2 Combine flour, almond meal and sugar in a large bowl. Stir in butter and vanilla until well combined. Press mixture evenly over base of prepared pan.

3 Cook in a moderate oven (180C) for about 10 to 12 minutes, or until golden. Remove. Stand for 10 minutes. Top evenly with apple.

4 To make topping, whisk all ingredients in a bowl until smooth. Pour over apple. Sprinkle with cinnamon sugar.

5 Return slice to moderate oven. Cook for about 25 minutes, or until topping is set. Remove. Cool in pan. Cover. Refrigerate for 4 hours, or overnight until cold.

6 Remove slice from fridge 30 minutes before serving. Lift from pan. Cut into squares.



Serves 4, Prep 15 mins, Cook 15 mins

2 x 300g chicken breast fillets 1/4 cup peri peri mayonnaise Salt and pepper, to taste 1 cup Panko breadcrumbs Vegetable oil, for shallow frying Bottled ranch salad dressing, to serve

CAJUN WINTER CARROT SALAD

2 x 300g bags carrot sticks

2 tblsps olive oil

2 tsps Cajun seasoning

100g baby spinach leaves

420g can corn kernels, drained

1 To make salad, combine carrots, oil and seasoning in a large roasting pan lined with baking paper. Toss to coat.

**2** Cook in a hot oven (200C) for about 15 minutes, or until tender. Remove. Stir in spinach and corn.

3 Meanwhile, cut each fillet horizontally through the side to give two thin pieces. One at a time, cover with plastic wrap and gently pound with a meat mallet to an even thickness (about 2cm). Place in a bowl with mayonnaise. Season. Toss well.

**4** One at a time, dip chicken in breadcrumbs, pressing on to coat.

**5** Heat enough oil in a large, deep frying pan to shallow-fry, over a medium to high heat. Add chicken. Cook for about 3 minutes on each side, or until golden brown and cooked through. Drain on absorbent kitchen paper.

**6** Serve chicken with salad drizzled with dressing.



#### Potato, Capsicum and Corn Soup

Serves 4-6, Prep 10 mins, Cook 20 mins

2 tblsps olive oil

2 onions, chopped

3 cloves garlic, crushed

2 tsps smoked paprika

2 tsps ground cumin

2 litres (8 cups) vegetable stock

400g can diced tomatoes

750g washed potatoes (3 large), peeled,

cut into 1cm dice

2 cups frozen peas, corn and capsicum Salt and cracked black pepper, to taste

Greek yoghurt, to serve

1 Heat oil in a stockpot over a medium heat. Add onions and garlic. Cook, stirring occasionally, until soft. Add paprika and cumin. Cook, stirring for 30 seconds.

2 Add stock, tomatoes and potatoes. Bring to boil. Gently boil for 15 minutes. Stir in frozen vegetables. Cook for a further 5 minutes, or until potatoes are soft. Season with salt and cracked pepper.

3 Serve with Greek yoghurt topped with cracked pepper.

Soup can be made up to four days ahead. Keep, covered, in the fridge. For a non-vegetarian soup, fry 4 chopped shortcut bacon rashers with the onion and replace vegetable stock with chicken. Or replace tomatoes with a 420g can creamed corn and add 300g shredded roast chicken meat

#### Cheat's Pumpkin and Pea Risotto with Pesto

Serves 4, Prep 12 mins, Cook 18 mins

2 cups chicken stock 540g sachet roasted pumpkin soup 2 tblsps olive oil 1 onion, finely chopped 1½ cups Arborio rice 1 cup frozen peas 2 tblsps fresh basil pesto ½ cup shredded parmesan Salt and pepper, to taste Extra fresh basil pesto, to serve

1 Bring stock and soup to boil in a large, covered saucepan over a high heat.

2 Meanwhile, heat oil in a separate, large saucepan over a medium heat. Add onion. Cook, stirring occasionally for about 3 minutes, or until soft. Stir in rice.

3 Add stock mixture. Stir to combine. Bring to boil. Cover with lid. Gently boil, stirring occasionally, for 12 minutes.

4 Add peas. Cook for a further 2 to 3 minutes, or until rice and peas are tender and stock is absorbed. Remove from heat.

5 Stir pesto and parmesan into risotto. Season with salt and pepper.

6 Serve with extra pesto.

Risotto is best served as soon as it's cooked as it will thicken on standing. If it does thicken, stir in an extra ½ cup hot stock or water. Fresh basil pesto is available in the refrigerated dip section of major supermarkets

#### Devilled Pork Chops with Chive Mash

Serves 4, Prep 20 mins, Cook 7 mins

1/4 cup Dijon mustard 2 tblsps tomato paste 2 tblsps brown sugar 2 tblsps Worcestershire sauce 4 x 200g pork midloin chops Steamed broccoli, to serve

CHIVE MASH

1kg brushed potato, peeled, chopped 1/3 cup hot milk 50g butter, chopped 2 tblsps thinly sliced fresh chives Salt and pepper, to taste

1 To make mash, cook potatoes in a large saucepan of boiling, salted water until tender. Drain well. Return to pan. Mash until smooth. Stir in milk, butter and chives. Season. Cover to keep warm.

2 Meanwhile, combine mustard, paste, sugar and sauce in a small jug.

3 Heat an oiled, large, non-stick frying pan over a high heat. Add pork. Cook, for about 3 minutes on each side, or until cooked to your liking. Remove pork from pan.

4 Reduce heat to medium to low. Add sauce to pan. Simmer, stirring for 1 minute.

Return pork with any juices to pan. Turn to coat in sauce. Remove from heat.

**5** Serve pork with mash and steamed broccoli.

Pork can be replaced with chicken breast fillets. Cooking time will vary. Don't overcook pork or it

How can I convert my meat casserole recipes so that I can make them in a slow cooker?

Felicity, via email.

A When using a slow cooker, you need to add less stock or liquid than in regular casserole recipes.

Make sure the quantity of food in the slow cooker fills the cooking pot halfway to three-quarters full.

For extra flavour, brown your meat and saute onions and other vegetables and herbs. As it takes a while for the slow cooker to reach a high temperature and start the cooking process, the cooking time is a lot longer than regular casseroles. Cook on low heat for about six hours or until meat is tender.




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




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#### **EAT WISELY**

Diets high in sugar and refined carbohydrates increase the risk of breast cancer, says Dr Sandra Cabot, co-author of The Breast Cancer Prevention Guide. 'So, limit your intake of bread, pasta, rice, potatoes, breakfast cereals and flour-based foods, especially if you don't exercise regularly,' she says. When you do eat these foods, make sure that they're wholegrain unprocessed versions without added sugar.'

Instead, base your diet on salads, cooked vegetables and good-quality sources of protein, advises Dr Cabot. 'Also include fruit, raw nuts, seeds, legumes and good-quality fats in your diet.'

#### **MAINTAIN** A HEALTHY

Obesity and being overweight increases the risk of most cancers, including breast cancer,

says gynaecologist Dr Raewyn Teirney. 'Fat cells produce oestrogen, which when in excess, is linked directly to an increased risk of breast cancer, which is why we need to keep our weight under control. You can work with your GP to help you kick-start and maintain healthy lifestyle changes,' she suggests.

#### **KEEP MOVING!**

Being physically active for 25 minutes a day can help maintain a healthy weight, which in itself reduces cancer risk, says Dr Elysia Thornton-Benko from Wellac Lifestyle, a wellness centre that focuses on prevention as well as surviving cancer.

'However, exercise reduces your risk beyond this – it's thought to be related to changes in hormones and an immune boost due to the physical activity," she explains. 'So it's not just about weight, even though this does play an important role. Exercise truly is a preventative!'

#### LIMIT ALCOHOL

An estimated one in 20 cases of breast cancer is linked to alcohol excess, according to figures from Cancer Council Australia. To reduce that risk it's important to limit your alcohol consumption, advises Dr Cabot. 'It's recommended women consume no more than two standard drinks per day, and have at least two alcohol-free days per week,' she says.

#### ENJOY A LITTLE **SUNSHINE**

Several studies have proven the ability of vitamin D to reduce

the risk of breast cancer, says Dr Cabot, 'Vitamin D is found in foods, such as oily fish, eggs and full-fat dairy products, however it is very difficult to get enough through diet – approximately 90 per cent of your requirement is obtained through sunlight exposure.'

Visit sunsmart.com.au to find out how much time you can safely spend in the sun to get your vitamin D.

#### **DO YOUR CHECKS**

BreastScreen NSW advises women to look at and feel their breasts regularly to check for any changes, and if you notice anything unusual, see your doctor immediately. For more information, visit breastscreen. nsw.gov.au.

Purpose is linked to realising that your goal makes a difference in the world or changes something unacceptable,' she says. 'When the going gets tough, you can remind yourself of why this goal matters so much and that will give you the courage and energy to continue.'

#### GOALS SHOULD SCARE AND EXCITE YOU

If your goal doesn't excite you, it will be hard to muster up the motivation to work for achieving it, says Chantal.

'And if your goal doesn't scare you, I would suggest you might be aiming too low,' she says.

Where to begin? Chantal recommends starting with habits that will give you more time and energy.

'Goals that improve sleep, diet, exercise or reduce stress, even if it is only a little, will give you more energy, which makes it easier to achieve the next goals.'

#### MAKE A GOAL OF DOING MORE OF WHAT YOU LOVE

We're all busy, and when we're snowed under, the first things we tend to compromise on is the time we spend on doing what we love.

'Most people don't realise that doing what you love isn't only just fun, it is also a powerful way to reduce stress, improve health and energy levels,' says Chantal.

'Replace some of your screen time with doing something you actually love, like painting, listening to music, reading, walking, even if it is just for 15 minutes.'

#### CELEBRATE YOUR ACHIEVEMENTS

Have you achieved a small victory today? According to Chantal, it's much easier to look at what we don't have than to focus on what we do have.

'Focusing on what you have accomplished increases happiness and confidence, which will make it easier to reach even bigger goals,' she says. 'Practising gratitude makes you more grateful, celebrating your wins makes you more confident.



Chantal says the key is to first achieve small goals that will give you drive and energy.

nfertility can be a heartbreaking experience for a couple to face, but it's made worse when men are shut out of the discussions, according to experts.

A British consultant has urged both partners to be involved in each stage of the process – and not just when the man's fertility is an issue.

Dr Gedis Grudzinskas believes men need to be involved throughout the process so they are better equipped to support their partner through IVF.

'Frequently I find women attending fertility appointments without their male partners, not necessarily because they don't want to include them or they don't want to attend, but because it is felt they are not required,' he says.

It's an issue raised by former Australian netball captain Liz Ellis in her book, If At First You Don't Conceive. Having struggled to fall pregnant with her second child, Liz has an insight into the pressures of infertility and urges couples to work as a team.

She says women are often left to do the 'heavy lifting' during IVF treatment, often because



want to put any more pressure on their partners.

Liz says men need to step forward. 'Commit to attending appointments together, be advocates for each other throughout the process and then, if you need to make a final decision it can be a joint one,' she says.

But she also believes fertility clinics need to work harder to involve men so they don't feel like a 'bit player' in the process.

Comparing her experience to 'hurtling down the infertility highway without a GPS', Liz believes looking after your relationship is paramount. She says even solid couples should still consider counselling and she urges them to keep talking.

While the stress of infertility may cause a relationship to break down, those who work as a team will create behaviours and habits

that will be invaluable for the rest of their lives, particularly if they are parents, says Liz.

Endorsed by fertility specialists such as Professor Michael Chapman, along with other parents who've also experienced infertility, Liz's book comes with the message that information is power.

As she told New Idea: 'Infertility leaves you with a sense that you've totally lost control, but what I learnt was that you have to be your own advocate. Doctors are doing their best, but they have lots of patients so you have to be educated and willing to push for the right treatment.'

As she says, the key questions for anyone going through it are: 'Why?' and 'What's next?' And nurturing intimacy through the process and ensuring IVF doesn't take over your life is also vital to surviving the experience.

n her latest role, Shailene Woodley has had to go to the extreme to portray the story of a woman lost at sea for 41 days.

Based on an inspiring story of survival, Adrift follows Tami Oldham (Shailene) and her fiance Richard Sharp (Sam Claflin) as they set out to sail from Tahiti to San Diego. But just weeks into their journey,

lost at sea with little food would result in dramatic weight loss, and as a result Shailene had to go on an incredibly strict diet.

'I had to lose quite a bit of weight to portray this woman's journey being stuck at sea for 41 days,' Woodley told Livestrong.

'I had no dinner for one month, and had a glass of wine before bed to kind of quiet down my hungry stomach and crash. And then for about two weeks

they run into one of the most catastrophic hurricanes in recorded history. In the aftermath of the storm, Tami awakens to find Richard badly injured and their boat in ruins. With no hope of rescue, they must find the strength to survive on their own.

As you could imagine, being

towards the end of filming, I was eating one can of salmon, two egg volks and some steamed vegetables, and that was it. And that was gnarly.'

To ensure that her diet wasn't a danger, Shailene ensured she was eating foods rich in nutrients.

'My body was getting all the nutrients it needed through the salmon and the eggs, but my stomach was not happy about the lack of carbohydrates,' she said. 'So that was definitely a lesson in resiliency, and not something I would ever do recreationally.'

In her personal life, the actress says she doesn't diet. 'I think it's important to not stress about what you're putting in your body.'






usical legend Sir Paul McCartney may be happily married now to American Nancy Shevell, but there will always be a special place in his heart for his late wife, and mother of four of his five children, Linda.

The 76-year-old singer songwriter was married to photographer Linda for almost 30 years before her untimely death and now, to mark the 20th anniversary of her passing, he's generously donated some of her photographic catalogue to the V&A Museum in London.

Paul McCartney was on a night out in a Soho nightclub in 1967, when he spotted Linda, already a well-respected and published photographer on assignment from New York, across the room. Despite the instant attraction, the pair went their separate ways that night – Paul back to his thengirlfriend, actress Jane Asher, and Linda returning to the US. However, almost exactly one year later they were reunited in Manhattan. Sparks flew and Linda and her five-year-old daughter, Heather, from a previous short-lived marriage, had soon relocated to Paul's bachelor pad.

In March 1969, the couple were married in a small civil ceremony in London, while Linda was four months pregnant with their first child together, Mary. Paul adopted Heather, who he adored, soon afterwards.

When The Beatles split, the newlyweds distanced themselves from the media frenzy, retreating



to their home in the remote English countryside and their farm in Scotland's Mull of Kintyre.

Away from the pressures and temptations of the limelight, the couple went on to have two more children, Stella, in 1971, and James, in 1977.

They raised their brood in as normal a way as possible, even educating them at the local free public school.

During this time both Paul and Linda became passionate vegetarians, turning their backs on meat in 1971.

This also offered a new career for Linda who published her first vegetarian cookbook in 1989, marking the beginning of a meat-free empire and years of tireless campaigning for animal rights. But just as her newfound career was flying, a routine check-up in December 1995 change her life forever when doctors discovered a tumour in her breast.

By 1998, tests revealed that the cancer had spread to Linda's liver. As her health worsened, they decided to head off for a final family holiday to the US. In Tucson, Arizona, surrounded by her four children and with Paul by her side, Linda finally succumbed to cancer three years after her initial diagnosis – she was only 56 years of age.


Paul was heartbroken. 'My world collapsed,' he said. 'I thought, "How the hell do I deal with this?" For about a year, I found myself crying...'

Today, Linda's legacy lives on in her still thriving meat-free business, the ethics of her children, including Stella, who has revolutionised the fashion world with her vegan clothing, and Mary, who has followed in her mum's footsteps carving out a career as both a photographer and vegetarian cookbook author and, of course, her iconic photography.

Paul's newly released collection of Linda's work does, of course, feature plenty of musical luminaries, but the stand-out pictures are those that captured their own personal love story — a romance during which time the pair barely spent a night apart.

And while Paul has married twice since – first to Heather Mills, which lasted for three years, and now to 58-year-old Nancy – it's evident from this recent photographic tribute that his late-wife is still very much a daily presence in his life. To quote the song, *My Love*, he wrote for her: 'Lord, I never say goodbye to my love.'

However, the comedian did reveal her beloved character would probably be just the same as always, but this time would be more concerned about social issues and 'opening her big Queens mouth for the greater good'.




