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
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


also be helpful once you graduate in finding good placements for you as they are more experienced in the job market by the time you graduate.

Being Interviewed?

Having presence of mind can save your day!

Almost all of us have heard about Job interviews and most of us may have already given a job interview for a summer job or plan to give one soon. The lucky ones planning to start their own businesses or take over their family businesses may not have to worry about Job interviews. So why is there always a sense of suspense and seriousness when it comes to Job interviews? Why have job interviews to be so formal. Many a times apart from your academic qualifications, the interview-

er also tests your presence of mind. That's where the fun begins!

Vikas Sarangi remembers his first interview when a MNC was hiring. "I wanted to show the interviewer that I will be loyal to the company. I said I will do anything for the company at which he sarcastically said 'will you jump from that window if I asked you to?' I said 'yes - sure'. At this he told me I am being over dramatic. I knew I was losing ground but had to reply him. So I said 'Sir you just told me if I could jump. You didn't tell if I have to jump in or out! Definitely I meant jumping inside the room! He has a good laugh and I was hired!" There's a story told about how an interviewer asked

the candidate to chose between one hard question and 10 easy ones. The candidate chose one hard question at which the interviewer asked him whether the chicken came first or the egg. The candidate promptly replied ' chicken' at which the interviewer asked him 'how can you explain it?' and the

candidate reminded him that he was to answer only one hard question!

"I was once asked the length of the table between me and the interviewer," says Ramesh

Anand about his campus recruitment days. "My request to let me have a measuring scale was turned down. After few seconds I told my interviewer that the length of the table was approximately 72 inches. he was taken aback and asked me how I came out with the precise length at which I told him that my resume which was on the table was printed on A4

paper. That's around 8 inches by 12 inches. So I mentally calculated that I could fit some 6 A4 sheets on the table. He was quite impressed and yes I was selected!"

Sometimes the interviewers try to confuse you too says Kanika Singh. "I remember being asked 'What is You' and I was like dumbfounded. Shouldn't it be 'What are you' or 'How are you? Why 'What is you'. I said I'm a fresher thinking that the guys grammar is really poor. He said 'I asked what is you'

suddenly it occurred to me what he was asking and I said 'You is a pronoun!"

A story is told about how a candidate was told to stand out of the cabin for some time when he went for the interview. He stood out there for a minute, 5 minutes, 10 minutes and no one called him. After few more minutes he was about to give up and leave the office when he was called in. Actually they were testing his patience as he had written that his strength was patience!

"Normally candidates come for interviews expecting us to ask questions only about their academics," says Veena Merchant who works as HR head at a well known tech company.

"Yes of course academics are important because we need to know the level of knowledge a person has - so that he can fit in the profile. However at times they may face a situation wherein they may have to use their gut feeling or think out of the box. It could be handling a pesky customer or some

> emergency on the work floor. Posing such questions or situations during the interview help us analyze their overall personalities," she adds.

Yes indeed. At jobs we may

be called to exhibit all our talents day in and day out. The recruiters know that very well. How we react to the environment around us in a challenging situation really can take us up on the career path. So guys! Good luck to you at your next interview!

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



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

TRIAL BY MEDIA Does It Help Us In Any Way?

Trial by media, presstitutes, paid media and many other derogatory remarks are referred to the media be it the Print, Broadcast or the social media. The power of media has increased substantially over the years. The recent illustration of the mistrial by media can be evident when the Allahabad High Court acquitted the Talwars' after 9 years of investigation, court trials, and imprisonment.

Any form of media be it the Television News Channels or Online News flooding on social media does impact public opinion. In Arushi Talwar's case, the Judges convicted Arushi's parents on circumstantial evidence. In this case, many journalists and media channels pronounced the verdict on the basis of the statements of so-called "impeccable sources" under the veil of anonymity. Every news channel in the quest for exclusivity came up with different facets of the story with Talwars' being the prime accused as the common factor.

Democracy empowers the citizens as the supreme source of authority. When there is a breakdown of the Legislature, Executive and the Judiciary the Fourth Pillar media or Press has a pivotal role as the watchdog of the functions of the Government and society at large. Even the judiciary on the basis of investigative journalism and several reports have taken up cases by using the cognizance of suo moto.

Considering the power of media and its massive outreach, media has turned into a market to grab the eyeballs of its viewers and readers with emphasis on increasing TRPs (Television Rating Point). There is a competitive environment in the quest for a sensational story. At times atmosphere created by the media in any case before the verdicts of the judiciary, can adversely affect the reputation or tarnish the image of the accused and the people involved in a particular case. The media tend to impede the privacy of people involved.

In High profile cases involving celebrities or politicians, or huge breakdown of Government machinery,



we often see there are no clear answers by the police authorities or by the bureaucrats. Not all but most of the cases in India there is no clear communication by the authorities on the local level or the top officials so in a broader sense a journalist is under a severe pressure and would lead journalists to find sources. There is a possibility of these sources giving out irresponsible statements with demanding anonymity and this often leads to distortion of facts and virility of false information.

The increased role of the media in today's globalized and tech-savvy world was aptly put in the words of Justice Learned Hand of the United States Supreme Court when he said, "The hand that rules the press, the radio, the screen and the far-spread magazine, rules the country."Therefore, in a broader sense, media Trials are harmful and certainly violates the freedom of the press. Therefore there is a dire need for "Communication with Credibility." However, it is not only the media but also on the part of the authorities to create transparency if the responsible officials speak openly we can certainly avoid such " Media Trials." **-Rahul Bagwe**

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

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




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

forgot to take music to the aerobics class. He took out a tape comprising of traditional Latin, merengue and salsa music and used it in the class. All members loved it. Then he improvised and modified the class to suit this music and thus was created a new concept of fitness. Alberto took this concept to USA and after heavy promotion and investment transformed into a global fitness concept.

Does it help to reduce weight?

Zumba Fitness is a dance based exercise class. As with other dancing exercise forms, you will burn calories and improve your fitness. An average class lasts from 45 minutes to one hour.

ZF is a mixture of aerobic and Latin dance moves. It uses the resistance of a person's individual body weight. Results will depend a lot on what you perform and which methodology you follow in the class. Different styles focus on different muscle groups to achieve desired results. In case of Zumba Toning style, people make use of lightweight sticks to form resistance and the target muscle groups are towards thighs, arms and abs. The dance form used in planning with a healthy balanced diet can work wonders in your weight lossprogram. Sometimes, people make assumption that that will use up about 800kcal and consume more calories as a reward tending to reduce the end result.

A few tips for beginners

5) Work as per your own level. Do not overdo looking at other participants.

6) Doing on your own watching exercise DVDs could result in serious injuries if you do not perform properly.

7) For enhanced fitness and weight loss results, it is advisable to use a combination of Zumba classes and a resistance program. Also, take a planned and balanced diet to see the wonderful results.

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



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
