





Bravely Facing His Future

Parkinson's disease diagnosis has ended Neil Diamond's five-decadelong touring career, but the "Sweet Caroline" singer refuses to let the neurodegenerative disorder get the best of him. "I plan to remain active in writing, recording and other projects for a long time to come," proclaims the star, 77. "Yes, it's a shock, but as Neil likes to say, the show must go on," a music insider and friend of Neil's tells Closer. While the Grammy Award-winning artist has confided to loved ones that his Parkinson's diagnosis was "soul crushing," he's now focusing on his health and getting back to his passion for making music. "He's doing yoga and meditating, and a live-in chef makes sure he eats healthy," notes the friend, adding that fans can take heart since the singer still has a stash of songs to share. "Neil has numerous recorded songs that have never been released." That's music to our ears!



he motto on the Seinfeld set was "No hugging, no learning," but laughing was always encouraged. That feeling of joy has sustained Julia Louis-Dreyfus as she continues to recover from breast cancer. "She's genuinely been in good spirits when we've seen her," Veep co-star Timothy Simons said at the recent Screen Actors Guild Awards, where Julia won best actress in a comedy. "She has a good sense of humor, which does wonders when you go through something like this."

Julia, 57, has been keeping a low profile — she stayed home during the SAG Awards, tweeting "[I] have to admit it's pretty fun to watch in my PJs." But her sense of humor still shines through. She congratulated her *Veep* castmates for winning best ensemble: "Miss being at the table with you all. How was the chicken?"

Of course, she's not home alone. Brad Hall, 59, her devoted husband of 30 years, has been by her side, and sons Henry, 25, and Charlie, 20, recently surprised their mom with a celebratory video set to Michael Jackson's "Beat It" when she completed her final round of chemotherapy. "Ain't they sweet?" she tweeted.

She's also received visits from her past and present co-stars. "All of them, every single *Veep* cast member, even her old *Seinfeld* cast, especially Jason Alexander," an

insider tells *Closer*. "They love her, and they've all been there."

NEW ADVENTURES

Though she still needs time to recuperate, Julia is itching to get to work on the upcoming farewell season of *Veep*. "We'll start filming in August, and it will air in 2019," co-star Matt Walsh reveals. "We've seen [Julia], she's done some table reads, she's doing well. She's very well-loved."

During her hiatus, she's building her strength with "a mix of Eastern and Western" medicine, says the insider. "Acupuncture, juices, meditation. She's always eaten well and had a trainer. She loves yoga."

Her spiritual practice has brought Julia a sense of gratitude that has served her well throughout her health crisis. "She often says, 'I know I live a charmed life," the insider shares of Julia, who was born into a wealthy family and has enjoyed unprecedented success as a sitcom star, winning Emmys for her roles on three different shows, including *The New Adventures of Old Christine*. "She doesn't feel sorry for herself and allows no pity. That's her strength, always being positive and looking ahead."

Perhaps that's why Julia inspires such warm feelings among her fans. "People feel very comfortable coming up to me and hugging me and engaging and of course I understand that: I'm in their living rooms," she says. "For the most part, I'm happy to engage. Maybe not the hugging so much, but talking is certainly fine."



ON THE MEND AND RARING TO GO By RONKELLY

othing is going to break Loretta Lynn's spirit or keep her from her fans. Having suffered a fractured hip on New Year's Day, the country legend was feeling better and back to her feisty self in less than a week. "Memaw is a rock star. Never underestimate her," granddaughter Tayla Lynn says, assuring Closer, "She's doing amazing! She's so tough. A little slip ain't gonna get her down." Adds a trusted family friend to Closer, "Loretta's undergoing therapy at her house, and they're saying she should be ready to go on tour come May!"

These updates about the resilience of the coal miner's daughter is music to everyone's ears, and the "Fist City" singer's been hell-bent on getting back into fighting shape so she can head out on the road. "When they lay me down six feet under, then they can say, 'Loretta's quit singing," she quips of how much being able to perform in front of live audiences still means to her at 85. Having been sidelined since last May due to a debilitating stroke, Loretta has been especially frustrated by this latest setback, but her passion for life is as strong as ever. "Her recovery from the stroke was definitely a miracle, and the love from her fans keeps her fighting. It's what pulls her through every time," the friend explains, offering even more good news about the singer's condition. "She's excited to get back to work. Her voice is still there and it's as strong as ever. She hasn't lost a note!"

Her indomitable drive is firmly intact as well. "As long as I'm on this earth," Loretta insists, "I will try to be on top somewhere. I'm not going to sit back and let somebody else take over the writing and the singing!" It's not surprising, then, that she pushed herself to be as prolific as ever with her songwriting, even as she dealt with all her recent health struggles. "Loretta is still writing songs. She writes all the time," the friend reports, noting her soonto-be-released album, Wouldn't It Be *Great*, has been completed for a while. "She didn't want to release it without being able to support it [by touring], but it was done last year. And she's



got others in the works, too!"

Once Loretta's career took off in 1960, it was hard for her to slow down. "Singing was easy. Life was hard," she jokes about growing up the second of eight children in humble Butcher Holler, Ky. In her 1976 autobiography, Coal Miner's Daughter, Loretta wrote she was just 13 when she married 21-yearold Oliver "Doolittle" Mooney. (A birth certificate found in 2012 by the Associated Press showed she was 16, though Loretta's not commented on the discrepancy.) The couple soon moved to Washington, and Loretta had four kids of her own by the time she was 24. When Doo gave his wife a \$17 guitar and challenged her to give music a go, Loretta wrote her first song in just 20 minutes.

"I was leaning up against the old toilet out there on the West Coast," she recalls with a laugh of her notso-glamorous foray into songwriting. She kept plenty busy as she honed her craft. "Me and my husband both worked," she says. "I took care of the farmhouse and cleaned and cooked for 36 ranch hands." After early hits like "I'm a Honky Tonk Girl" and "Wine, Women and Song" started winning her fans and critical acclaim, she put cooking duties behind her. "I thought, gee whiz! This was an easy job," she says of earning her way as a singer.

TELLING IT LIKE IT IS

In 1966, she scored her first No. 1 hit, "You Ain't Woman Enough (To Take My Man)," marking the first time a chart-topping country song was written by a woman. Her down-home style and straight-shooting, fearless lyrics, like in "Don't Come Home A-Drinkin' (With Lovin' On Your

Mind)," were often inspired by her own life, something that further endeared her to audiences.

"She really revolutionized country music at the time," Country Music Hall of Fame and Museum editor Michael McCall tells *Closer*. "Early in her career, some people wanted her to get slicker, wear high heels and not use words like 'ain't' or 'holler,'" he explains. "They wanted her to be more cosmopolitan. But [producer] Owen Bradley told her, 'Be yourself,' and she put the same language she used while talking

guage she used while talking into her songs."

With Loretta, what you see is what you get.

"She's the most real person you'll ever meet," McCall promises. "There's no filter between who she is and how she presents herself." That's why she never shied away from calling Doo out through the years

in certain songs, like "Don't Come Home A-Drinkin'," for example, in which she vented some frustration. "If a man drinks, he's going to come home drinking. He liked to drink," she says. Through 48 years of marital ups and downs, though, Doo remained her one and only true love. "If I write a song, he's in there somewhere," Loretta says of her husband, who passed in 1996.

Another thing Loretta never backed away from was tackling controversial subjects in her music. She sang the praises of birth control in 1975's "The Pill," just a few years after she playfully griped about being saddled with a houseful of kids in "One's on the Way" in 1971. "You can call me your number one you-know-whatkind of stirrer. Always stirring stuff," Loretta notes. "Women were kind of held down," she says of old limits placed on female artists. And she was determined to sing about whatever she wanted.

"But everything I sang about was everyday living," she points out, and her warts-and-all approach to her songwriting continues to influ-

"There's no one like Loretta," Grammy-nominated singer-songwriter Brandy Clark, 42, tells *Closer*. "Her music's completely autobiographical and she's lived such a rich and interesting life. What I take from her is to tell your truth."

And when three-time CMA Entertainer of the Year Alan Jackson, 59, was being inducted into the Country Music Hall of Fame last October,

he wanted nobody but Loretta to do the honors. "She was the first woman to receive the Entertainer of the Year award [in 1972]," McCall notes, "and Alan thinks she showed everybody how to write about their life. He counts her, Hank Williams and Merle Haggard as his heroes, so it was really important to him" to have her there.

That induction came just five months after Loretta's stroke, yet she rallied for her protégé. "He's the

only one who could bring me here," she said as she made her triumphant return to the public eye. Alan was thrilled. "Well, Loretta Lynn said I should be here [in the Hall of Fame]," he gushed. "That's all I needed to hear!"

Perhaps no one knows the power of Loretta's seal of approval more than her sibling, singer Crystal Gayle, 67. "As a child grow-

ing up, I looked up to my sister," she tells *Closer*. "Even as a little 4-year-old, I'd put lipstick on and ask my mother, 'Do you think Loretta would think I'm pretty?""

It meant the world to Crystal that

Loretta helped induct her into the Grand Ole Opry last January. "She's fantastic! My sister is the greatest singer on Earth!" Crystal raves, and Loretta beamed throughout the entire event, announcing that she and Crystal have recorded some music together that's yet to be released.

TOUR DE FORCE

Family has always meant everything to Loretta. "Her children have been her greatest support system. They all live near her," the friend says, and her 53-year-old twins, Patsy and Peggy, have helped her emotionally and professionally as well. "My daughter Patsy, she manages me and she takes care of me," Loretta says. "I don't know what I'd do without her." Patsy even served as co-producer on Wouldn't It Be Great (along with Johnny and June Carter Cash's son, John Carter Cash). "This

record deserves me at my best and I can't wait to share it," she says. It's been her goal to promote it with a new tour, tentatively scheduled for the summer.

Endless support from her fans this past year has been transformative and healing. "Loretta says she can literally feel the power they're giving her. They're the reason she's here, the reason she is who she is," Loretta's grandson Anthony Brutto says. "It's amazing to see the will and fire she has inside." Also giving her strength? "God," says granddaughter Tayla. "And let's not forget her new little puppyshe affectionately called Bimbo."

Maybe the only one not surprised by Loretta's recovery is Loretta. "I can outwork any 26-year-old under the table," she says, and you'd be hardpressed to find anyone in Nashville who would argue with her.

MEMOIR, THE ICONIC ACTOR OPENS UP ON LIFE, LOVE AND WHAT HE'S LEARNED

t was the mug shot seen around the world: In 2002, Nick Nolte was arrested for driving under the influence, and his wild-haired booking photograph instantly went viral. "In 1992, *People* magazine had named me the sexiest man alive," he recalls. "Ten years later, I looked to all the world like a madman — and I couldn't be sure which of the two kinds of notoriety was worse."

Fans wondered how Nick could have fallen so far. In his new memoir, *Rebel: My Life Outside the Lines*, the star, 76, reveals the lifetime of torment that led to that rock-bottom moment: "I drank in order to deal with anything I found difficult — relationships, failed projects," he says. "I started using harder drugs to close off the pain and suffering of life — in other words, to escape life."

Nick's unhappiness and self-destructive tendencies began early. Raised by a shell-shocked World War II vet dad and a hot-tempered mom in Iowa, he threw himself into football but failed out of three colleges and was arrested at 20 for selling fake draft cards. "I used self-inflicted physical pain to distract me from my emotional state," he says. "I needed to get a clearer view of how to begin making a life for myself."

He became obsessed with acting and moved home, where he suffered a mental breakdown. "My room became a self-imposed sanitarium," he says. "I held the key, and no one confined me to the cell except me, yet I virtually never left."

DOWN-AND-OUT

An acting coach helped him find his way and after years of struggling, Nick suddenly

found fame at 35 with the miniseries *Rich Man*, *Poor Man*, which led to a string of big-screen hits like *North Dallas Forty*, 48 HRS. and *Down and Out in Beverly Hills*. "My career as an actor had skyrocketed to heights I had never imagined," he says. "But instead of finding peace and a degree of meaning in my success, I continued to find life offstage and away from the cameras challenging."

Finding lasting love proved the toughest task of all. "Even more than football or acting, women have been the major passion of my life," he says. "I'm fascinated by them." His three marriages failed, but his last—to Rebecca Linger, from 1984 to 1994—brought him a son, Brawley, now 31. "For the first time in my life, I experienced unconditional love in the way only a parent can," he says of Brawley's birth. "It was wonderful."

These days, Nick lives happily with Clytie Lane, his former Pilates instructor, and their daughter, Sophie, 10, in a garden-filled Malibu home. "I had been married three times, and three times those forever-after relationships had collapsed," he says. "This time, [I'm] devoted to Clytie, but we chose not to marry, and that's fine with me."

As a father, Nick has discovered the true meaning of life. "Your responsibility to love and protect your child is the work you offer the world," he says. "On October 3, 2007, the day of her birth, I began my most important work: helping little Sophie travel as high and as far as she could, kept aloft and safe by her family's love."


RELIEVES MIGRAINES

Simply inhaling the scent of lavender delivers relief in 71 percent of migraine episodes in 2 hours, say $scient is ts in the journal {\it European}$ Neurology. The credit goes to the aromatic compound linalool. "When inhaled, it enters the bloodstream through mucous membranes in the nose and blocks pain-transmitting receptors on nerves," says Bindiya Gandhi, M.D., an integrative physician in Decatur, Ga. She advises pairing the oil with the 4-7-8 breathing

mones that trigger the pain. To do: Inhale the aroma through one nosexhale for 8 seconds; repeat on the other nostril; then repeat the technique twice without the oil.

SOOTHES SINUS PAIN

Saltwater rinses ease sinus inflammation and the headaches it triggers, but research suggests those made with Dead Sea salts work best. In one study, the salts reduced pain, pressure and congestion by nearly 80 percent, making them as effective as nasal steroids. "The salts contain anti-inflammatory minerals like magnesium and zinc that relieve pain in 5 to 10 minutes," says Dr. Pescatore. To make your own rinse, boil 2 cups of water, add1tsp. of Dead Sea salts; let cool, then use a neti pot to flush sinuses.

A Blooming Bowl to LIGHT UP THE DAY

Floral displays help ward off winter blahs, and this season we're getting an extra hit of happy with this vibrant and velvety arrangement



Florists are brightening up winter tabletops by setting African violets in sleek silver bowls. "Here, colorblocking the white and fuchsia flowers creates interest, and their tissue-like petals boast eyecatching texture," says floral pro Deborah Pomroy Moyer. "Plus, the scoop bowl adds a modern twist — it's a cheery yet so-chic accent!"

Start by gathering five 4-inch plastic pots of African violets in pink and white hues. Nestle the pots one at a time in a shallow 12-inch bowl, alternating colors as you go and angling the plants outward to show off the blossoms. To keep the display from shifting, insert handfuls of Spanish moss (from the craft store) between each plant.

African violets prefer to drink their water from the bottom up. So instead of watering the top of each plant, florists suggest removing the pots from the bowl about twice a week and letting each container soak in a tray filled with 2 inches of water for 10 minutes. And when a bloom shrivels, just pinch it off — a new flower will grow in its place!




Claude Akins 1926-1994







What made you want to become an actor in the first place?




Is it true you're in *The Graduate*?

THE INTERNS His first regular TV role was on The Interns in 1970 with Broderick Crawford (bottom). "He was a pussycat," Mike recalls. "Every New Year's after we did the show, he called to say he loved me."





GOOD FATHER "I was very much a handson dad," says Mike, with Michael and Erin in 1988. "I'm a big hugger. They are, too, happily. I wanted to make sure they didn't suffer what I suffered with my father." Lord, I was in heady company with Mike Nichols, Dustin Hoffman and Katharine Ross. It's such an important film that I left it on my résumé for a long time.

Were you anxious about replacing Wayne Rogers on $M^*A^*S^*H$ in its fourth season?

I was scared to death because Wayne loved the cast, and they loved Wayne, and I thought they were going to hate me for coming in and taking his place. But the minute I showed up, they were welcoming and warm.

How close did you become and stay with your castmates?

We all remained very close. It was a creative community. Alan Alda was wonderfully generous, and I just adored Harry Morgan.

How did the studio react when the cast and crew chose to end the series in 1983?

They went bananas. They said you can't have an end-of-the-show episode because *The Fugitive* had wrapped up its story and found the one-armed man, and it killed the show in syndication. I said, "Most people know the Korean War ended."

What was it like shooting the emotional, record-breaking series finale?

It was one of the hardest things I've ever done. We wanted the opportunity to give these characters an ending and, as actors, say goodbye to each other and thank you to the audience. It was deeply meaningful to all of us and a wonderful, powerful experience.

Your first marriage ended while you were on *M*A*S*H*. How did you navigate that situation with your son and daughter?

I bought a house on adjoining property to the house where I had lived with their mom and built a stairway between them so the kids could go back and forth. I'm sure damage was done in the process of the divorce, but we went to great lengths to work it out.

How did you know Shelley was the one?

When I was doing The Interns [in 1970-'71], she did an episode, and I thought, "What a sweet woman," but I was married and she was married. Then in 1982, after I had been separated for two years, I had just come back from doing human rights work in El Salvador, and I was emotionally wrecked, and I saw her across the room at a network meeting in San Francisco. I told her, "Every time I see you, I get this warm feeling." We talked and talked, and as we came out of the hotel, a cable car came up the hill and I said, "Do you want to take a ride?"

And the ride's still going?

We've been married for 33 years. She's just the most wonderful woman one could ever know, so that makes it easy for me. I got lucky enough to find her.




I don't expect to be remembered, except by my family and a few other people. But I guess if people think of me, I hope it's that I was an honest, decent, caring man.





er megahit from *Titanic* promises "My Heart Will Go On," but when Celine Dion is ill, the same can't be said of her show. "You never want to let anybody down, but sometimes you get sick," the singer announced on Jan. 10 at The Colosseum at Las Vegas' Caesars Palace after being forced to cancel a show. "Today, I'm not very good. I'm not at my best," she added, and she also had to cancel six other performances in the New Year.

An official statement cited "congestion and irritation of the vocal chords due to a lingering cold," and Celine's physician has called for full rest until the problem clears up. But those closest to the mom of sons René-Charles, 17. and twins Eddy and Nelson, 7, fear she's been pushing herself too hard in the wake of her husband-manager René Angélil's passing in January 2016. "This has been the roughest week for her since René died," a friend tells Closer. "It looked like she was well enough to return to the stage so she did one show, but she felt worse after that. She just needs some extra time to heal and recover." Hitting the pause button is frustrating for the chanteuse, 49, who's eager to put the finishing touches on a new CD. "That's going to have to wait until she's 100 percent," the friend cautions.

When similar throat inflammation side-



lined the singer in 2014, she had her husband to lean on for support and guidance. Now, Celine's left to balance her health concerns and business commitments on her own: She has another round of Vegas dates in March and a tour through Asia kicking off in June. Ultimately, the friend says, "She will do whatever the doctors tell her is best, but I'm sure she'll be back in March."

Celine is just as confident. "This too shall pass," she insists, determined to regain her strength and return to singing as soon as she can. "I love to be onstage. I love the people and the energy they give back. That's what I feed my soul with—it's like food!" It just might be the best medicine she could ask for. —*Ron Kelly*

one calling the shots in the courtroom, but a new lawsuit has put the tough-talking justice in the hot seat. On Jan. 19, Kaye Switzer and the trust of the late Sandi Spreckman, two producers who were responsible for bringing *Judge Judy* to TV in 1996, filed suit against Judy, Big Ticket Television and CBS over syndication profits. "It all hinged on Judy raking in a whopping \$95 millionplus for her back catalog of shows last August," a source tells *Closer*. "Kaye, along with Sandi's estate, believed they were being left high and dry by the deal."

Judy, 75, is one of the highest-paid TV personalities, earning \$47 million last year. After she agreed to sell the *Judge Judy* library to CBS, the lawsuits over money started rolling in. But Judy isn't stressed about the outcome. "She believes the show became this monster success off the sweat of her own brow and the force of her personality," says an insider.

While the insider notes Judy "was always fond" of Kaye and Sandi, the fact is they were fired by the show's production company before *Judge Judy* ever made it on the air. What they're fighting for now is the 5 percent of the \$95 million library deal — \$4.75 million — they claim their original contract gave them. "Judy still has warm feelings toward Kaye and the memory of Sandi," the insider explains. "But she just doesn't see this as her fight."

So the woman famous for sayings like, "I'm the boss, Applesauce," appears to be taking the lawsuit in stride. "Judy never entered a contract with Kaye and Sandi personally," the source says. "Whatever piece of the pie the gals got was out of Judy's hands." In other words, it's not for her to judge.





Besides, for Christina, who turns 38 on Feb. 12, playing the lead in the life of 3-year-old son Freddie is best part she's ever had. "I think what I do with my life matters more."

2 WILD CHILD

She'd become a star playing Wednesday in the Addams Family movies. "[But] because I was so celebrated for being a child, I held onto that immaturity for a very long time. It was the thing that made me special. Then at a certain point...it's not so special to be immature."



1995 KEEP THE CHANGE "I'm like one of those adaptable people," reflects Christina of her early roles such as in the coming-of-age pic Now and Then. "I can be young and cute when I want to be, and I can be really mature when I want to be. It's kind of weird, like I'm the incredible changing girl."
